TELETYPE FROM 8TH AIR FORCE FOR INFORMATION OF ALL PERSONNEL.

QUOTE:

Enemy aircraft spotted twice once at 0034 hrs 8 miles east of Burdago and 8 minutes later ten miles west of Burdago. There are grounds for believing that enemy agents have been dropped. Three descriptions have been given of one suspected agent one: about 6 feet spoke English well very overcast and what appeared to be a Haversack on shoulder two: 6 foot round shaped hat similar to fatigue hat worn by 3 Soldiers greenish overall suit and Haversack three: 5 foot 9 inches thin built belted Mackintosh dark brilly hat about thirty years old Haversack. Was challenged by an RAF Officer and a Patrol at Pousy Hill four mile southwest of Burdago at 2000 hours 25 Feb 44. He ran across the downs in a south-east direction toward Swerleigh Lakes. Intensified search requested. Burdago located in Wilts north of Marlborough.
