The following paragraph of Letter, No. 0427 in memo, sub: "Safeguarding Military Information," is quoted for the information of all:

2. It should be obvious to all that the plans of projected operations must be guarded with the greatest of diligence to deny this information to an enemy. The Espionage Act 50 U.S. C. 32, 32, as amended, Army Regulations and amplifying current instructions, if correctly applied, will enable the Commanding Officer to enforce the necessary discipline.

3. The violation of any of the instructions noted above is an extremely serious offense. Recently a senior Air Corps officer was relieved of his command because he had violated security regulations. Disciplinary action for violation of security regulations is to be promptly applied regardless of position or rank.
