We have dormitory accommodations for 175 men, and there is a fine modern swimming pool in Luton, all of which offer a week-end of good recreation."

SUGGESTION BOX

SUGGESTION: "Suggest that the old clothes depot referred to in the Staff Meeting Minutes for July 13 be established. I have a number of old clothes I'd like to get rid of and I'm sure there are more officers and men on the post with the same problem.

ANSWER: Any person having clothing or other personal articles they wish to turn in for the British Red Cross may leave them with the Officers' Laundry.

SUGGESTION: OUR MOST INEFFICIENT MOTOR POOL. ".....More transportation is available than ever before, yet our departments must wait, wait, wait merely because the motor pool insists upon sending a driver with every vehicle. Our departments have driven and cared for their own trucks, etc., for the past three years. This has not resulted in any marked misuse of said vehicles. Must we assume that it would do so now? There is still work to be done....."

ANSWER: "Misuse" of vehicles was not the reason for pooling our vehicles - it was poor upkeep, inefficient utilization of vehicles and a much greater load on the motor pool (sight-seeing trips, delivering our own rations daily etc.)
