SUGGESTION BOX:

SUGGESTION: "Why doesn't the Army quit dealing with that laundry at North Finchley? They don't wash your clothes properly besides losing half of them, you get back cotton socks for wool and when you salvage them you have to take cotton. The buttons fall off your drawers and shirts. On top of that you get OD shirts for khaki and vice-versa.

Why don't someone get on the ball and either have the service improved or quit automatically deducting money from every man whether or not he uses the service. That's not fair at all. The Army has control of you in every other way but when they start telling you how to spend your money that's going too far! Is it a station SOP or from higher Headquarters?"

ANSWER: RSP: U.K. Base Circular No. 4, dd 19 Feb 1945. Since no U.S. Quartermaster mobile laundry unit is available for this station we must take advantage of the British commercial facilities. These facilities are allocated by the District Quartermaster in conjunction with the British Deputy Director of Ordnance Services in the service command concerned so as to insure full utilization of available facilities.

A recent survey of the station showed better than two thirds of the enlisted personnel using this service every week and that less than five percent of the bundles going to the laundry had missing items upon return. In each instance losses have been made up.

The Advance Laundry, North Finchley has been contacted regarding the above complaints and corrective action is being taken to eliminate same.

You are behind times about being forced to use this service. Automatic Monetary deductions from enlisted man's pay for laundry services not rendered has been eliminated. Effective 1 June 1945, a charge of .25 per week will be made only for laundry bundles actually sent. This system of deduction is coordinated between the squadron supply room and the S.M. Personnel section and Station Headquarters.
