SUGGESTION BOX:

SUGGESTION: "Why can't 368th Engineering persons get a break on passes now that V-E Day is here? They give us one 72 hour pass a month, while all other departments in the squadron get day off a week. Besides, they tell us when we can have them and no changing with anyone. Can have over night and six hour early occasionally which is of no use to majority only for those with wives in Bedford. Also have wait till 3:00 to pick them up".

SUGGESTION BOX (continued)

ANSWER: Because of the number of men in an Engineering Section, it is necessary to put the passes on a scheduled basis. All personnel of the 368th Bomb Sq (H), are required to wait until after 1500 hours to pick up their passes so that men will not be leaving the station all during the day. All passes begin at 2400 hours so no time is lost. Effective 1 July, 1945, one 72 hour pass plus two 24 hour passes will be authorized per month. As near as is possible furloughs will be given every three months.

SUGGESTION: "368th Engineering, why not give us a break on passes now that we have less planes and more men to a plane. We still get same as we always did, one pass a month or over. How about a 48 every two weeks or give us our 7 day leaves every three months."

ANSWER: Although VE Day brought a halt to combat operations it ushered in a new phase of work for engineering personnel. This past week June 16-23, saw the virtual completion of this work plus the transfer of seven aircraft from this squadron. Consequently a revised pass program will be put into effect 1 July 1945. One 72 hour plus 2 - 24 hour passes per month. As nearly as possible, furloughs will be given every three months.
