INFORMATION:

1. Paragraph 3, Station Regulation 150-1, dated 22 March 1945 is quoted for the information of all station personnel:

3. LIBERTY RULES:

a. Separate Liberty Runs are operated for Officers and EM. Two trucks are furnished for the Officers each evening, one leaving from "A" Mess at 1830 hours and one leaving from "B" Mess at 1900 hours. No other stops will be made on the station to pick up Officers. The Senior Officer on board each vehicle will be in charge and will ride in the cab. These trucks will leave from the Granada Theater in town at 2215 hours and 2300 hours to return to the station. On Thursday and Sunday evenings one truck will leave from the Granada Theater at 2215 hours and two trucks will leave from the Officer's Red Cross Club at 2400 hours. There will be no 2300 hour truck leaving town on these two nights. No EM will ride Officer's Liberty Run trucks.

b. Trucks for EM Liberty Run leave the station from the Cross Roads each evening at 1800 hours. The Officer in charge of the 2215 run will ride in lead truck and Officer in charge of 2300 run will ride in No. 3 truck in the convoy. Trucks Nos. 1 & 2 will leave the parking lot in town

(OVER)

at 2215 hours to return to the station. The remaining trucks will return at 2300 hours with truck No. 3 in lead: No Officers except the two Officers in charge will ride on EI Liberty Run.

NOTE: "No EI will ride Officer's Liberty Run trucks; and no Officers except those in charge of the EI Liberty Run trucks, will ride in Enlisted Men's Liberty Run trucks."
