SUBJECT: Intelligence Narrative  
Mission: 8th January, 1945; Target of Opportunity.

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H), APO 557.

1. Narrative

306th flew 38 a/c including one Gee H/PPF, three PPF, and three spares as 40th "A". Route: English coast 5045N-0050W, 0931; 4929N-0008E, 0959; I.P. 4833N-0724E, 1122; target Speyer, 1141; turned left 180 degrees and back on course at about 4847N-0732E; 4938N-0008E, 1401; Salsay Bill, 1434; base 1528.

Buckeye Red reported 30 minutes before I.P. that he could not find the target, but that it was 10/10 in area. Five minutes before I.P., called again and said he could see ground through heavy haze, but wasn't sure he was over target; said run should be by instruments, but visual correction might be possible.

H2X equipment on deputy lead and High lead worked satisfactorily. Lead PPF gave faint returns, and briefed secondary did not come in. Low lead PPF aircraft landed away. Lead Gee H equipment was out throughout mission, and deputy Gee H a/c was unable to take off due to engine failure.

2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

There was no E/A opposition on this Group.

Fighter support was first met at I.P., and was good area support from then on.

3. A.A. Gun Fire

Moderate, accurate tracking A.A. fire from Mannheim/Ludwigsheim area immediately after bombs away, lasting about 3 minutes and tracking group around turn off target. Damage: Lead; 1 missing, 1 crashed in England, 1 severe, 4 slight; Low; 1 crashed at base, 2 slight; High; 4 severe, 4 slight.

4. Bombing

Deputy Gee H a/c failed to take off. 306th leader discovered at rendezvous that lead Gee H-PPF ship's AFCE was out and that the Gee H on which the mission depended was not operating. On the bomb run lead mickey operator could not locate Landau blip and bombed Speyer. Other mickey operators agree that Landau gives poor returns. High and Low felt they bombed secondary, Landau, but indistinct ground detail on pictures would seem to indicate that all 3 squadrons bombed Speyer or immediate vicinity.

5. Leaflets

A/c 153-G, pilot Nahabedian, dropped 10 T262 on Landau.

6. Weather

10/10 cumulus, with large holes, over continent. Heavy ground haze in target area prevented visual run or visual correction, but permits identification of detail in some photos. Dense, semi-persistent contrails from 24,500 to 28,500.

7. Aircraft in Distress

A/c 819-Q, pilot Young, left formation in France because of shortage of fuel and is believed safe at Messenger.

A/c 376-F, pilot Hallum, left formation just before English coast on return, low on gas and with feathered propeller. Believed safe in England.

A/c 438-U, pilot Law, crashed at Hanston with two engines out.

A/c 715-V, pilot J.L. Davis, crashed at base with two engines out.

Five a/c landed away in England, one in France, and are included in this report.

8. Aircraft Returning Early

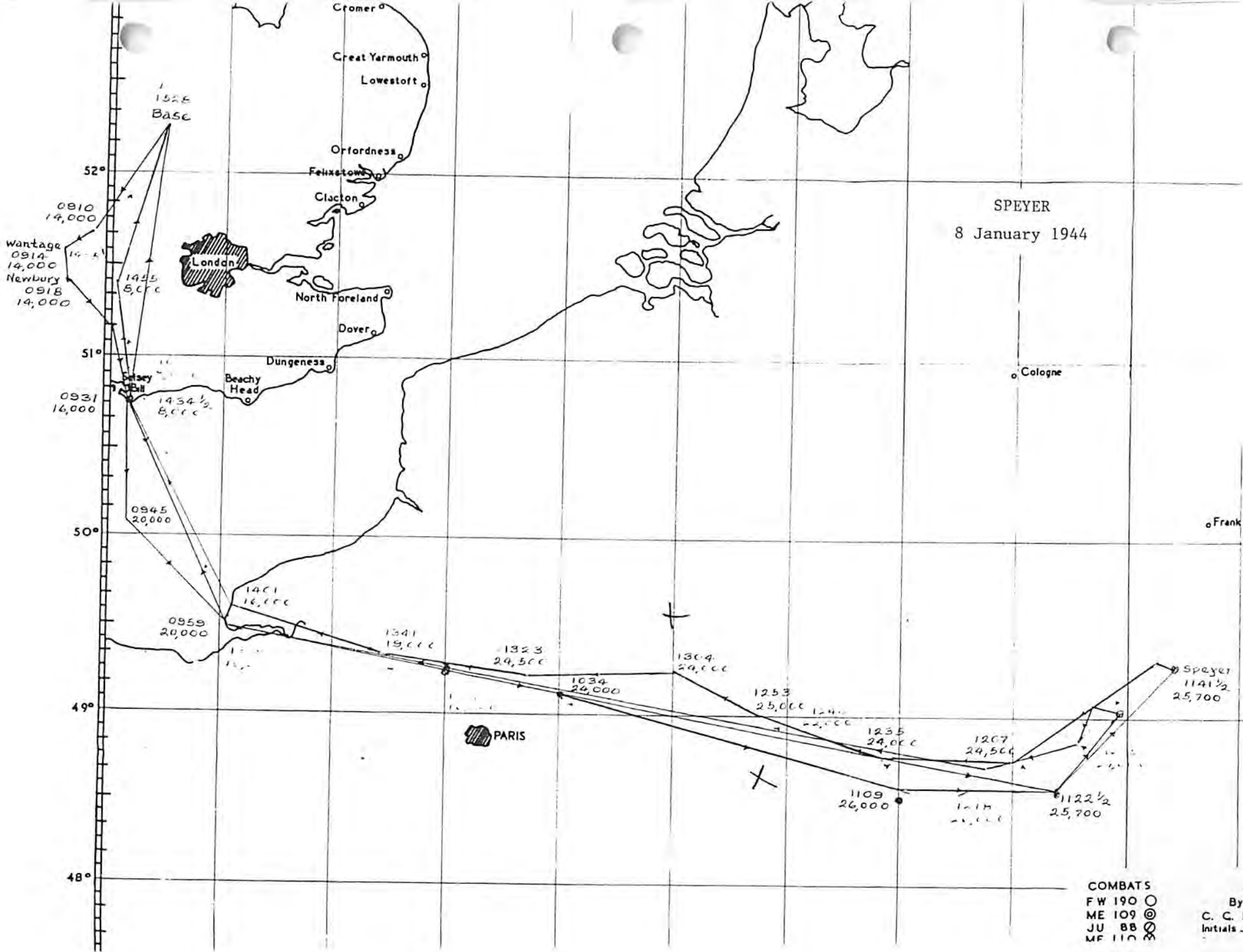
