This person talked with an American accent and claimed to be a Texan. At the time he was wearing an officer's field cap; officer's O.D. shirt without shoulder or collar insignia; officer's dark O.D. slacks; black shoes; but was not wearing a tie, blouse, or field jacket.

His physical description is as follows: AGE, 19-20; face - full; Nose - sharp. HEIGHT, 5' 7". WEIGHT, 130-140 pounds; build - medium; complexion - fair, clean shaven.

(2) All commands should be on the alert for the appearance of this person and should take steps to detain him or interrogation wherever he may be located.

(3) In view of the above stated facts, it appears appropriate that measures be taken to review and tighten up on all security regulations, especially those relating to conversation and "loose talk" in public places.
