Dear Fred:

Many thanks for your letter, pointing out the shortcomings and personal quirks of the editor. I deserve them, and as you so ably pointed out, my own interest in the combat aspects shows through.

But, may I turn the tables?

I'd be delighted to have a long story for Echoes on the Ordnance organization. I have a number of pictures of bomb dumps, bomb trailers, loading of bombs, etc., which would help make a whale of a good piece that everyone would enjoy. I just need a writer who knows something about it. I don't.

I have asked other men to do the same thing, but have yet to receive anything. I'm waiting, and frankly, looking forward to more variety in Echoes. It needs it.

I make no apologies for <u>First Over Germany</u>, as I intended from the very inception of the project to write a history about combat flying. Other aspects of the organization were mainly incidental to that story.

But Echoes is an entirely different matter, and I hope that you will seriously consider doing a story for me. I could use as much as 8 or 10 pages double spaced, perhaps having to run it over two issues.

If you'll start writing, I'll search out the pictures I have, get copies to you so that you can keentify anyone you can, and I guarantee that it will be a popular story.
