In your January issue of 306th Echoes you requested information on the identification of personnel in certain photos. On page 6, photo 6-B -367th (center, top row) this is William H. Baker's crew and they were in the 423rd - not the 367th. The crew members are as follows:

Top row from left to right - Martin J. Burnett - Radio Operator, Richard O. Kutchens - Co-Pilot, Sam J. Cangelose - Bombardier, Albert P. Compagna Jr. - Navigator, and William H. Baker - Pilot. The bottom row from left to right - Atlee D. Beckerdite - Tail Gunner, Raymond M. Frey - Ball Turret Gunner, Perley A. Foster - Waist Gunner, and Walter R. Clark - Top Turret Gunner.

Walter Clark also flew a tour of missions with the 367th so that may be the Clark (possibly second from the right, bottom row, of photo 6-A - although he looks a bit different) mentioned under photo 6A.

We were there at the end of the war and flew with varied crews. I had 18 missions and I really don't know how many missions the other crew members flew.

Baker, Cangelose and Clark are deceased - I don't know the status of the other crew members.
