I'm sorry for the delay in answering your query. I finally found some documents that I can send you excerpt photo-copies of. I do not have orders promoting me to Master-Sgt. so I am sending along other documents to substantiate the fact.

On arrival in Thurleigh I was Assistant Crew Chief to Henry Balawajder. A short time later I was given a ship to crew. I served as Crew-Chief with a Tech-Sgt rating, until I was made Master-Sgt. & Line Chief. The rating was contingent on accepting the position of Line-Chief.

In looking over your list of Master-Sgts. I find you

are pretty much on target,  
except for a few corrections.  
I would not know people  
who were connected with Ordnance,  
Communications or Operations.  
My memory would serve only  
those connected with Engineering  
in the 423<sup>rd</sup> Squadron.

Henry S. Balawajder went from  
Crew-Chief to Flight Chief

Bergeron Walter went from  
Crew-Chief to Line Chief

Elmo Tonks went from  
Line-Chief to Flight Chief

The rest of the men, to the best  
of my memory, remain as you  
list them.

I replaced Elmo Tonks as  
Line-Chief according to documented  
dates on March 22, 1943.

I'm sorry this is all the help I can be to you. I realize I should have kept a Diary while in Thursleigh, but there was really no time. We were too busy doing.

One more thing. I understand that Henry S. Balawajder is now deceased. You could check on that.

I still hope to make it to one of the reunions. I would enjoy seeing the old Buddies.

AWARDS OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL

Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended and pursuant to authority contained in letter, HQ Eighth Air Force, File 200.6, 4 July 1944, subject, "Awards and Decorations," the BRONZE STAR MEDAL is awarded to the following-named Officer and Enlisted Men.

FRANK S. KAMINSKI, 0-461668, Major, Air Corps, United States Army. For meritorious achievement as Engineering Officer of a heavy bombardment Squadron in connection with aerial operations against the enemy in the European Theater of Operations during February 1943. Entered military service from Alabama.

IRVING L. STILTZ, 19000667, Master Sergeant, Air Corps, United States Army. For meritorious achievement as Flight Chief of heavy bombardment aircraft in connection with aerial operations against the enemy in the European Theater of Operations from 4 November 1943 to 20 June 1944. Entered military service from California.

GERALD G. MCDEVITT, 11016071, Master Sergeant, Air Corps, United States Army. For meritorious achievement as Line Chief of heavy bombardment aircraft in connection with aerial operations against the enemy in the European Theater of Operations from 4 November 1943 to 20 June 1944. Entered military service from Vermont.

MAT M. KUTULA, 37030304, Master Sergeant, Air Corps, United States Army. For meritorious achievement as Flight Chief of heavy bombardment aircraft in connection with aerial operations against the enemy in the European Theater of Operations from 4 November 1943 to 20 June 1944. Entered military service from Minnesota.

HARRY A. SIMONS, 19000666, Master Sergeant, Air Corps, United States Army. For meritorious achievement as Flight Chief of heavy bombardment aircraft in connection with aerial operations against the enemy in the European Theater of Operations from 4 November 1943 to 20 June 1944. Entered military service from California.

WALTER H. PERGERON, 11036053, Master Sergeant, Air Corps, United States Army. For meritorious achievement as Line Chief of heavy bombardment aircraft in connection with aerial operations against the enemy in the European Theater of Operations from 22 March 1943 to 15 May 1944. Entered military service from New Hampshire.

WILLIAM F. CAVANESS, 18057048, Master Sergeant, Air Corps, United States Army. For meritorious achievement as Chief of the Tire Change Section of a heavy bombardment Group in connection with aerial operations against the enemy in the European Theater of Operations from 1 June 1943 to 1 June 1944. Entered military service from Texas.

Master Sergeant WALTER H. BERGERON, for meritorious achievement as line chief of a heavy bombardment squadron for a period of 22 March, 1943 to 19 May, 1944. During this period Sgt Bergeron has vigorously performed his duties as line chief, setting an admirable example to the remainder of the maintenance personnel of his squadron. His ability to instill a sense of responsibility and assuredness in his crew chiefs and flight chiefs is equalled by his own zeal to get out and work with his subordinates. During the initial period of high altitude, daylight, precision bombing, pilots complained that either No. 2 or No. 3 engine supercharger regulator caused lagging or erratic manifold pressure on practically every mission. This condition prohibited the pilot from maintaining proper formation. Sgt Bergeron devoted his full attention to devising a method to flush out the oil system of the regulator. After much time and effort he improvised from spare airplane parts, a device for flushing out the oil lines leading to the supercharger regulator. This device cleans the oil sludge in the lines and regulator, thereby lessening the possibility of oil congealing at altitude where temperatures are extremely low; it provides an easy check on the proper functioning of the regulator and other parts of the supercharger system and flushes out any water vapor in the regulator's oil system, reducing the possibility of freezing. This device has proved highly satisfactory for preparation for high altitude missions and has contributed materially to the success of many vital bombing missions. This is a good example of Sgt Bergeron's technical skill, resourcefulness and devotion to duty. Sgt Bergeron's achievements and ingenuity have earned for him the highest respect from both the ground and the flying personnel. His actions during his entire assignment as a line chief have reflected the highest credit both on himself and on the Armed Forces of the United States of America.


TO : Commanding Officer, 423rd Bombardment Squadron (H), 306th Bombardment Group (H), APO 557, U. S. Army.
