Thank you so much for the clipping concerning Maj. Jesse A. Bryan.

As to his WWII combat history:

He joined the 306th bombardment Group, 369th Bombardment Squadron, U. S. Eighth Air Force, in England 25 October 1944, as the bombardier on the Harold Mattson crew. Bryna was a second lieutenant at the time.

He flew something over 20 missions, principally against Germany, and I regret that I cannot give you an exact count. While doing this he was decorated with the Air Medal and also received two oakleaf clusters to the Air Medal.

On 10 January 1945 his crew, with Mattson as the pilot, was shot down on a mission to Gymnich, Germany. Attached is a copy of a page from First Over Germany, which tells about the fate of this aircraft on its final mission. Bryan was then a prisoner of war until April or May 1945.

His Army serial number during WWII was 0-773294.
