from my relations my name is Cynthia Barrozza.

I I WAR BRIDE + Jim writing these few lines for him.

my Husband was Stationed at Thurleigh 306 Bomb Group
8th Air Force. He was a Ball Turret Gunner. Staff Sergeant
423rd Bomb Squadron, here is what he has to say

I do remember Snuffy Smith because I flew.

Five of his missions + got busted for it. Snuffy
+ him was very good friends.

I remember very well a mission that Snuffy
flew on, when he got the medal of honor.

We were flying to the left of Snuffy when the
plane was hit. The last thing Snuffy did in order to
put out the fire, he urinated on it + we all laughed
about it.

We all got tired of saluting the new officers
on the field so Snuffy decided, to put a
stop to it. he would walk pass the officers
Quarters + wear his medal of honor so the
officers would salute the medal + not Snuffy
thats how he solved the problem, of saluting
the officers all the time.

Snuffy also married an English girl from
Bedford.

I remember Captain Check on his 25th mission
I was his Ball Turret operator that day
coming in for a landing, we sent up red flares
claiming that a dead person was aboard,
when we landed in Thuleigh, they carried
Captain Check's Body out & the head was missing
they sent me back to see where the head was.
I found the head & put it in the Bomb site Bag
& carried it out.

I get sick everytime I think of it,
And the news of the write up brought back a lot
of memories. on 17th mission I was transferred
from my crew, which were all officers & one
enlisted man. on a raid over Bremen.
that was the mission that I lost my crew.
they all ended up in a prisoner of war
camp

THE 306TH ECHOES

Obituary for Staff Sergeant Alfred James Carrozza - Belly gunner Thurleigh 8th AF - 1st Division, 40th CBW, 306th Bombardment Group (H), 423rd Squadron. * Flew 50 missions - 1st Mission - May 13, 1943 - Last Mission October 14, 1943

Died 'D' Day, June 6th, 2001, age 78, in Ojai California. Al was born, lived and raised 6c, who had 7gc, in Southeastern (Coatesville) Pennsylvania. His wife from, Bedford England, Cynthia Ena Pill, Carrozza preceded Al in death on November 12th, 2000.

FOUR 4 - CONFIRMED KILLS & 2 DAMAGED -

12th Mission *ship # 841 DESTROYED ONE FW 190* 14th Mission *ship # 841 1st trip to Norway by the "USAAF"* 25th Mission *ship # 892- DESTROYED TWO FW 190 confirmed & damaged ONE ME 110 [wounded in left foot]*

26th Mission *bombed FW plant, Kassel, Germany ship # 963 RECEIVED Purple Heart-* 28th Mission *ship # 941 bombed Russia airfield - 1ST BY THE American AF.* 32nd Mission *ship # 221 bombed Renault Works-received French Croix de Guirre*

45th Mission *bombed repair depot, France ship # 221 got a Jerry ME 109 Yellow Nose- DESTROYED - Three crewmembers, Pete, Robby & Bob also got one each.* 49th Mission *ship # 945 Oct. 10th, 1944 lost half of right wing and had a crushed ball turret.*

50th Mission *Schweinfurt ball bearing plant ship # 812 Black Thursday, Oct. 14th, 1943, plane received [20 hits-w/one clear through the ball turret]*
