The popular Miller Band regularly broadcast on the BBC from the Corn Exchange in nearby Bedford (5 miles from Thurleigh). On several occasions made their broadcasts from a hanger at our base.

In Dec. 1944, Miller and an Air Corps pilot left the 306 Bomb Base during stand-down weather conditions headed for France. Miller's plane disappeared without a trace. The popular music world was devastated with the loss of America's favorite band leader.
