Much, much to much had happened and it would take a book writer to put it together. Dur fortress was named, "Sataris Lacky, I was its nine o'clock gunner (waist). We were in the group when the aucricans bombed Berlin in its first daylight raid. We were a group leader plane and we were leading the first raid when we get word the mission was scrubbed when we were more than 1/2 way there. Thent day it was Berlin again, we were to the right of a least plane. Just before we reached the target area that least ship was on fire, from The bomb boy to the tail. Staid with to target area, driffeed its hombs then turned to the left and blew up. There were missions when we could have malked on the flate, others that had some humor and other like the field was forged in and a plane almost cracked us, we clove. Then the Time we landled with no skin on the right wing, two 2011 M'S on through the main spar and one exploded between two gas tout Seen many a plane going down both ours of theirs, after we landed and it was a rough mission we would walk around the plane and count flak holes - one mession it had 43 holes. air force I have target Germany book and several others, one is an air force book with a fecture of the back end of our grant, wing a 50-88 on its tail.
