

I was amazed to see the photo of the 1024-
1628TH combined. This photo was taken to honor
the Frankenberg on being accepted into the pilot
training program. He left soon after for the USA.

The 1624TH originated as the 705TH in
Boise AFB in July 1941. The rolling stock was
the hot new B-26's. Lots of casualties at first. We
spent spring of 1942 at Eeter Field, La (P392) Then
back to Boise. In June 1942 we went to
Alamogordo AFB N.MEX (A202). Late Sept. saw
us on our way to embark for overseas.

It was thirteen days, by way of Iceland, an
unforgettable experience followed by night only
travel in Scotland & England in blackout con-
ditions. At first we were in tents and were fed
at a British mess. And it was!

The combining of the two organizations was
a little difficult at first. I don't think it was the
influx of new faces as it was the loss of the
1024TH designation. Later a cadre was pulled
for a B-24 trip in Rethel near Norwich. Such
names as Steadman, Grizmacher, Detteburg, Coch-
rum and Risberg and others I can't recall ~~are~~
not in the photo. Thanksgiving day 1943 another
cadre left for Rockhampton near Norwich. The ones
I recall are Plante, Ferrell, Lawrence, Ater, Rankin

and myself. We formed the 145th ord there,
and so knowledge of the 162nd pretty much
ends there also.

I have enclosed a complete list taken
from the back of my photo. My list is most-
ly last names as that was the common
way to address everyone.

If I can be of more service let me
know. Keep up the good work and I
will remit a check to Bill Collins to help
you do it.

Your most interesting information arrived during this past week while I was out of the state, but I was delighted to read it.

I will expect to rerun the picture with the identifications, as soon as I can work out all (or most of) the first names. I have a roster of about 10,000 names of men who served with the 306th, so I think I can locate most of the first names.

This is a "major" find for the group, as such pictures usually just remain unidentified.

I will also use most of your letter, combining it with a little other information I have on the ordnance detail, so it should prove interesting to a lot of people.

If you come up with any more data or lists of names concerning the 1024th or 1628th, let me have a copy of it.

When I have completed the list of first names, I'll send it along to you for any possible additions or corrections you may have.
