
The enclosed material explains what I am about, and I certainly want to include material about your unique experience.

1. According to Staff Sergeant HASTINGS 8. KEY, 18058352, Tail Gunner and only known survivor of the collision on 22 October, 1944, Aircraft Mos. 44-8099, and 43-37976, the following is what occurred:

S/Sgt Key states that he has no knowledge of how the collision came about. All he remembers is being in the air with his parachute partially on and subsequently An the water. He states that while in the water he observed two to four (he is not sure of number) parachutes in the air—probably the Havigator, lat Lt Charles F. Handler, 0-719941, and the Radio Operator, S/Sgt Donald W. Coleman, 39129085, whose bodies were recovered. It is Sgt Key's opinion that there could not possibly be any more survivors.
