Sergeant McAlister was missing in action for some time before the Red Cross was able to establish that he was a Nazi prisoner. His Flying Fortress, on which he was a waist gunner, failed to return in March 1944 from its 12th mission which had as its objective Brunswick, Germany. Sergeant McAlister was stationed in England at the time.

Holder of the Air Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, Sergeant McAlister was born at East Stoneham. He was graduated from Deering High School in 1942, and for five years was a carrier boy for the Evening Express and Press Herald.
