Dear Bill:

The enclosed copy of the front and rear page of The Rushden Echo and Times of June 15, 1945 is self explanitory. The leaflet was the entire bomb load of our Bel7 on D Day, June 6, 1944. They were dropped on the German troops around Caen. The pictures enclosed show Methuselah a B-17G3Serial # 42 102969. The name came from the last 3 numbers, 969 as Methuselah lived 969 years.

The picture shows the original crew of which I was the Bombardier. The names are listed on the rear. We all finished our tour without a scratch. However Marion Plumb the Co Pilot was later killed in a plane crash after leaving the ETO. Unfortunately over the years I have lost contact with all but Bill Canedy of Greenfield Mass. You have his address on your mailing list.

The crew shown was assigned to Flight B, 367th Bomb Squadron. We were a replacement crew which arrived at the 306th BGin May of 1944. I was the first of my crew to complete my Tour. However, instead of being sent back to the States, I was assigned to Station 112, the Combat Crew School at Bovington, as a ground school instructor.

I shall be moving to Florida in a month or so. You can be sure that I will send you my new address, as soon as available. Enclosed also, is a check for \$10 to help keep the 306th Echo continue.

I've about got the copy for another Echoes in hand, and expect to have it ready for mailing in early April.
