Sincerely Med Teets ON OCT 15, 1990 WE DRIVE UP TO THE RAE STATION IN THURLEIGH. RAE STANDS FUR ROTAL A ELO SPACE EXPERIMENTAL STATION. I WENT INTO THE GUARD HOUSE AND IDENTIFIED MYSELF AS A MEMBER OF THE 306 4 BG OF THE EIGHTH AIR FORCE. HE MADE A PHONE CALL TO MR. FRANKLIN AT THE AIR BASE. HE INDICATED THAT HE WOULD COME TO THE BASE ENTRANCE - WHEN HE ARRIVED AND WE TALKED BRIGFLY, HE SECURED PASS'S FUR US AND WEN ALL GOT IN HIS SAAB. AFTER DRIVING A SHOET DISTINCE, RALAH PUT ON A TAPE OF GLEN MILLER MUSIC. WE STUPPED ON A TARMAC - YOU COULD SEE THE STEEL TIE-DOWNS FUR THE 17'S. MANY OF THE TARMACS ARE STILL THERE. WE SAW ONE HANGER THAT WAS LEFT FROM WWII. THE OTHER THECE ARE NO LUNGER THERE.

WE THOU DROVE OUT OF THE MAIN SATE TO SET OUR CAMERAS - THE SUARD ALLOWED US TO RE-GUTER AS LONS AS LIVE WERE WITH RALPH. WE THEN WENT TO AN AREA WHERE DINSCEBERRY HALL AND MY BARRACES WERE STILL STANDING, BUT JUST BAREAT. WE ALSO SAW THE MESS HALL WITH THE KITCHEN IN THE CONTER AND THE OFFICERS MESS ON ONE SIDE AND MOCOM'S ON THE OTHER. WE ALSO SAW THE BATES. WHICH IS BUILDING WERE THE OFFICERS COULD TAKE BATES. WHICH

WE THEN DROVE OUTSIDE THE BASE AND SAW THE MEMORIAL FUR THE 366 THE SCHOOL CHILDREN PUT FAESH FLOWERS ON THIS SITE. SUNDAY MANY FLOWERS 1/40 BEEN PUT THERE CELEBRATING THE 50 " YEAR OF "THE BATTLE OF BRITAN". RALPH TOOK US TO THE LUCATION WHERE I RUDE MY BIKE TO THE FOX HEAD INN. WE COULD ALSO SEE THE OLD 14" ON 15th CENTRURY CHURCH THAT WE IND VISITED DURING THE WAR. WHILE ON THE BASE WE SAW WHERE THE BASEBALL FIELD WAS. THIS WAS THE SITE FUR A MASSIVE BEER PARTY THE NIGHT OF VE DAT. SOME 2 /2 HOURS LATER WE ARRIVED BACK AT OUR CAR, BY BASED ON WHAT I HAD BEEN TOLD TO EXPECT - THANKS TO RALPH FRANKLIN- FOR ME IT WAS A THEILL I SHALL NOT FORSET.

ONE OF THE FIRST THINGS THAT RALPH SHOWED US
NERIAL VIEW
WAS A MAP OF THE AIR BASE AS IT WAS IN WWIT.
HE ALSO HAD AN AERIAL VIEW OF THE PRESENT AIR
BASE WITH ITS 10,000 FOOT PLUS RUNWAY THAT WAS
100 YARDS WIDE.

ON OCT 15 th 1990 WE WENT TO NORM'S AIR BASE AT GRAFTON-UNDERWOOD WE SAW THE MEMURIAL AT THE END OF ONE RUNWAY. THERE WERE FLOWERS AT THE BASE AND IT WAS VERY NICE. WE WENT TO THE CHURCH - SAW A MAN WORKING AND ASKED 111M WHERE THE POST OFFICE WAS. WE LEFT THE CAR AND WALKED UP THE RUND ALLING A CANOL TO THE POST OFFICE. WE WERE MET BY BARBARA BLAND. SHE GAVE US THE KETS TO THE CHURCH - WASKT INTO THE CHURCH AND SAW THE STAINED GLASS WINDOW DUNNIED BY THE 384 WORK BGAUTIFUL. A WORKMAN WAS WORKLING ON THE STEEPLE. WE WENT BACK TO THE POST OFFICE AND MET QUINTON BLAND WHO IS THE HISTORIAN OF THE 384 WE HAD A NICE TALK. HE GAVE US SEVERAL SPENT 50 (AL SHELL CASING THAT HAD BEEN PLOWED UP UN THE FARMS THAT HAVE NOW RICLAIMED THE AIK FIELD. A WAY GNUOYABLE VISIT. NORM SIGNED A BOOK WITH HIS PLANE SERIAL NUMBER AND I SISNED A BOOK ABOUT THE 300 "

CHILDREN HAVEN'T FURGOTTEN THE AMERICAN AIR MEN.


