list of Planes and Pilots find
Schoolfield. Schoolfield led
missions under his position of
A/C crew list down 11 Jan 44.
for AC-30782. I decline that
AC 42-9713 down 11 Jan 44
is causing some confusion.

On that date we were landed
at Andrews Field (Street Saling)
in 42-9713, A/C belonged to
Schoolfield. As the A/C never
returned to Thule. How does
this square with your information.

Perhaps the Queen 11 Jan 44
against A/C 42-30782 showed
to A/C 42-9713 "Pretty
"Baby"

Once again Phoenix
reunion was great.

Check from Minot, N.D., was the pilot of the "Chennault's Pappy" airplanes & flew with him in the last, as his co-pilot, ^{and} until his death on his 25th mission. "Miss Patricia" was the plane he flew as first pilot and commander of Flight C. The Squadron for all of these was the 423rd Squadron.
