6. AIR MAIL MAIL SERVICE

The following extract from Postal Circular No. 5, U. S. ARMY, May, 1944, is quoted for the information of members of this command:

L. Air Mail V-mail Service. 1. The War Department has announced that effective 15 May, 1944, V-mail letters mailed by the Armed Forces overseas, prepaid at the Air Mail rate (6¢) will be given Air Mail service in the United States, after processing at domestic stations of destination. V-mail letters bearing postage at the Air Mail rate will be given preferential handling over ordinary V-mail throughout the V-mail channels.
