4. NOTICE - The following Letter, Hq. 1st Bomb Division, dc 20 May, 1944, is quoted for the information of all.

SUBJECT: Commendation.

- TO : All Combat Wing and Group Commanders, let Bomberdment Division.
- l. In official report from Headquarters, Eighth Air Force, indicates that during April, 1944, the lst Bomberdment Division led all the divisions of the Air Force in inflicting demage on the enemy. Combined averages for February, March and April, 1944, show that the bombing results achieved by this Command were also the best in the Eighth Air Force for the entire three-month period. Both in April and for the three-month period the bombing average of each of the four Combat Vings of the Division was higher than the average of the Eighth Air Force as a whole.
- 2. In addition to dealing these most effective blows to the German war machine, the 1st Benbardhent Division excelled in all separate entegories covereby the report. The Combat Wing with the best bombing record in the Eighth Lir Force during April and during the combined menths of February, Harch and April, 1944, was the 41st Combat Wing, or this Division. Turing April, the 1st Bumbard ment Division's record for gross errors was less than 75 percent of the general Air Force average. Superior maintenance work by the Division's ground crews resulted in our having a higher ratio of fully operational aircraft to aircraft thend then any other Division. The statistics further show that the 1st Division has the greatest number of aircraft bombing targets, and achieved the highest percentage of aircraft bombing in relation to aircraft dispatched. The abortive rate for the 1st Division during this time was only 53 parcent of the general abortive rate for the Air Force. Our loss rate was down to 2.8 percent of accredited sorties, which was by a considerable margin the lowest in the Eighth Air Force.
- J. It is a matter for keen pride that this Command, whose original combat units blazed the trail for the Eighth hir Force, in Europe, and for many months fought the American air war against Germany alone, shold continue to hold first place in the compaign. Due to the quality of your leadership, the skill and courage of our combat crows in battle and the tireless efforts of our supporting personnel on the ground, the lst Division's curve of efficiency and accomplished has been rising steadily for months. In the period immediately before us, which will be the most critical time of all, we must make it rise even faster.
