SUGGESTION BOX:

SUGGESTION: "I suggest that all NCO's who eat in the consolidated mess, with the exception of 1st Sgts., be required to do their share at K.P. duty. Department heads and crew chiefs have been called essential at their regular duties; yet they are given furloughs every 4 months and 24 or 72 hour passes every other week. Why must the time be cut between corporals and buck sergeants? Most of us have been corporals for 2 years or more because of 10's - But when there work to do in our departments, I venture to say every man is expected to do an equal share - and the bucks and staffs are the first ones to goof off to get ready for a pass (usually about 12 hours in advance). So how can bitching about the food they're getting. If they were put to work at their share of unloading, cleaning and serving, they would realize that they're getting fed in a way they should be thankful for. And I believe about 75% of them would get up from the table, leaving it looking better than they apparently did in their own homes. The suggestion box has been helpful to me. We appreciate its' good. - And hope it will correct the aforementioned inequality."

ANSWER: The personnel who perform K.P. Duties is determined by the policy of the Unit concerned. SD has been informed that most organizations run a duty roster including personnel with the grade of Sergeant or lower. NIP, you know!

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SUGGESTION: "Now that work has slackened on this station, why not put extra personnel in the three mess-halls to give relief to the cooks and NCO's who still have to serve three meals a day, seven days a week? This would enable the mess personnel to take advantage of the I & E tours."

ANSWER: Mess personnel here are given plenty of time off in recognition of the good job they are doing, and you have the nerve to say "seven days a week" when every one knows that you work only 6 days a week. Mess personnel have as much time off as any personnel on the station, and more than some. SD believes you can make an I & E trip by arrangement thru your squadron.
