ANSWER: SB and everyone else on the station is well aware of the situation
created by the lack of battle participation stars for the Service Group, but in
selecting men for transfer the "letter of the law" is being rigidly adhered to.
High point men must come first, and whether or not the points were awarded fairly
is a different question. As a result of your suggestion the personnel section
at Division Hq was contacted - their answer was substantially the same as this
one.

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SUGGESTION: "QUOTE: Memorandum Hq, 6th Air Force, No. 88-2, dated 23 Dec 44.
"OWNERSHIP OF VEHICLE"

"Today it was brought to my attention a small "M15 SCOUT" vehicle was
parked in front of headquarters. Also noted that an OFFICER parked it there.
I, the undersigned, built a vehicle similar to the above mentioned last April.
This machine was built entirely of salvaged parts by myself, without aid from
any department, and entirely on my own time.
