ANSWER: The University courses and sightseeing trips to other countries (EAE program) was designed for non-operational units "scrapping out" redeployment and occupational units. At the present time this group is operational. When our mission is completed and the group becomes CAF, it is hoped that all qualified personnel will be given opportunity for University courses, etc. In the meantime, take advantage of our airplane trips to Scotland and southern England, as well as truck trips to surrounding places of interest.
