SUGGESTION BOX:

SUGGESTION: "According to "Safety" Posters, the Army seems to be attempting to make everyone safety conscious, eliminating an unnecessary loss of man hours. Yet, at the same time, on this station, hundreds of man hours are lost daily through drilling, inspections, fire arm instructions, gunnery and lectures, all of which have proven to be not only a waste of man hours but also very dull and boring. The above mentioned drilling, etc. would be more suitable to an Army recruit rather than to a large number of men on this station who have well over 85 points and are supposedly eligible for separation from the service.

In the early months of 1942 the Army evidently thought it more important that we receive our GI training and get over it for some of us only had a few hours of this so called "Basic Training", if "Basic Training" is so important surely we would have received our share of it when rather than now. If at all possible, why can't such things be stopped so that we can concentrate all our efforts toward the completion of the assignment we have been handed since V-E Day, after which, we may possibly be allowed to return to the States."
