I came to the PX barber shop at least twenty times during that period at all hours of the day only to find the door locked - I came there at 9 M., 11 M., 3 PM and 5 PM trying to outsit the barber so I could get my hair cut but he must have seen me coming because I never could get in. No, of course I'm not trying to blame the berber, it isn't his fault. I found out why the door is locked. He works alone and leaves a number of men in the shop and then locks the door otherwise he'd have hundreds crowded in the place and of course it would be impossible to cut all of their hair, naturally - so I hope no one blames him in the least. Why in the world haven't we more barbers??? Let's get civiliance if there isn't enough GI's to cut our hair.
