Seattle Set For 1993

Seattle is it for our 1993 reunion, a journey to where the B-17 made its maiden flights and the aircraft manufacturing capitol of the world.

Dates are Thursday, 9 September, through Saturday, with the annual reunion banquet that night.

Warren Wilson, 368th engineer and POW, and Dinwiddie Fuhrmeister, 367th pilot and operations officer, have agreed to share the chairmanship for the event. Wilson lives in Port Ludlow and is a Boeing retiree, while Fuhrmeister lives in Tacoma and was promotion director for the newpapers there for a number of years.

The Red Lion Inn Sea-Tac, immediately adjacent to the Seattle-Tacoma International Airport, will be the head-quarters for the reunion. A number of Turn to page 8

Plans Are Refined for Our Foray Into WWII Memories

By the time you read this there may be only four to six weeks remaining before the planes fly from all over the United States towards the great Heathrow and Gatwick airports near London, carrying an increasing number of 306th men, their spouses, children and friends to a grand reunion.

It will really begin when the plane doors come open, the passengers disembark into the passport control and luggage retrieval areas. Within minutes after the customs work is over, the 306th people from these various flights will be gathered into holding areas to once again meet old friends and to await briefly for another departure.

Boarding our own buses, you will be taken out on the high speed London Orbital highway. A stop for snacks and other necessities will be made at a hotel just off the Orbital at Watford. Then the M5 north will be located and it won't be long before the buses arrive at the Swan and Moat House hotels, which face each other across the stone bridge spanning The Great Ouse.

Greeters will be waiting at the two hotels, and a speed up room assignment and key retrieval system will be put in effect so that those on the first bus will be out of the way by the time a second bus arrives.

The first bus will be out of Gatwick at 8:30, and a second departs at 9:30, and that one will pick up additional passengers at Heathrow. Buses will go from Heathrow at 8:30, 10, 11:30, 1:30 and 3:30.

There is Still Time

At a recent meeting in Minneapolis with committee, travel consultants, and Ralph Franklin from Bedford in attendance, plans were carefully gone over for the entire event. Franklin reports that enthusiasm for the reunion is very high among British friends of the 306th in the Bedford area, and that he is receiving a high degree of cooperation from many people who have fond memories of the three years that the 306th was a part of Bedfordshire.

Those at the Minneapolis meeting were startled and pleased to learn that at that point ticket sales to British for the hangar dance had been halted at 1,500! This will be a Wednesday night event on the old base, and the hangar in which it will be held may have been the one in which you danced in 1942-45. (Two of the old hangars remain, although they have been relocated from the line that once stretched along one side of the field.)

Tuesday night's welcome reception at the Corn Exchange is by invitation only, as that old structure that echoed to the music of Glenn Miller in 1944, will only hold we Americans and a limited number of British. It is a very short stroll from the two hotels to the Exchange.

A major event will be the memorial service to be held at the 306th Bomb Group monument at Thurleigh, which stands in front of what was once the 40th Combat Wing headquarters. As space is very limited close to the memorial, no one will be admitted to the area until our buses have arrived and let their passengers off so that they can be seated or find good places to stand to witness the ceremonies there

Donald R. Ross, 306th president and reunion chairman, will preside. A USAF chaplain will offer the invocation, and later the benediction, and a color guard will come from RAF Chicksands, an American unit. Col. Robert Brotzman, vice commander of the Third Air Force at RAF Mildenhall, will speak briefly and Russell Strong will present a short history of the 306th.

Lunch will be provided at the base. During the afternoon tours of the present base, with particular attention to those 306th relics still existing, will be provided each of the buses. Then people will return to the hotels for rest and refreshment before going out to the hangar dance.

It is hoped that during the time spent at Thurleigh on Wednesday that a few "antique" and current aircraft may be on display.

On Thursday morning we will go back to the buses for the short trip to the American Turn to page 2

cemetery at Madingly, just to the west of Cambridge. Again, Ross will preside, and there will be a chaplain and USAF color guard from RAF Mildenhall to assist with the service. William A. Houlihan, former president of the Association, will deliver a eulogy here. After the ceremony there will be sufficient time for everyone to view the Wall of the Missing, to check out the graves of our comrades who are there, to inspect the beautiful rose garden and reflecting pool, and no one will want to miss the chapel at the far end of the pool.

American military cemeteries abroad are really impressive places to visit.

Leaving Madingly, the buses will take us a few miles southwest of Cambridge to Duxford, which served as a WWII American fighter base, and is maintained today as such a facility. Here we will have lunch, with a place service available at 12:30 and 1:30 in the Officers' Mess.

The Groups Split

In mid-afternoon the buses will begin to leave, those going on to London's Cumberland Hotel by one route, and those returning to Bedford by another.

The registration as of 26 June shows 250 have selected the A program, which includes two nights in Bedford and the remainder in London, and 85 who will be in the B program, which spends two more nights at Bedford before moving on to London.

In addition to these two large groups, another 28 persons as of 26 June have elected to participate in various parts of the reunion program.

On Friday the **B** group, operating out of Bedford, is scheduled to make bus visits to the villages of Thurleigh, Keysoe and Milton Ernest. At each stop there will be an observance staged and the Americans will have an opportunity to mingle with the townspeople. This group will leave then on Saturday morning for London.

A pub crawl is being planned in London for Saturday night with opportunities to visit three or four pubs in the general area of the Cumberland hotel.

Special London Tours

On Friday in London there will be a half day city tour in the morning, and in the afternoon there will be tours to Windsor Castle or to the RAF Museum at Hendon and the Cabinet War Rooms. These may also be repeated on Saturday afternoon in order to accommodate those who arrive from Bedford.

Sunday morning's optional event is a choral mass at St. Paul's Cathedral. In the afternoon the annual meeting of the Association will be held, and it is likely that all present officers and directors will be on hand. Voting will be for a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and one director for a three-year term. The nominating committee will report at that time.

On Sunday night the Annual Banquet will be held.

Then, Monday morning will arrive all too soon, and about half of the group will be leaving the hotel for flights homeward.

Perhaps the earliest risers will be those 77 persons who have signed on for the extension trip to Belgium and France, visiting 15th Century Bruges, Paris, Bayeux and the Normandy Beaches, and returning for flights home Monday, 8 September. The extension tour northward to Scotland, plans to leave the hotel at 8 a.m. on 31 August, heading for Oxford, and then on north to Coventry, York, and Edinburgh. They will go back south through Carlisle, Chester, Glouchester and Bath, before arriving at London Saturday night for Monday departures.

Obituaries

LTC James W. Barkwill, 369th navigator (William Haase crew), died 16 Oct 71 in New Haven, CT. He was chief of USAF recruiting at Madison, CT, at the time of his death. Reentering service in 1949, Barkwill served with SAC, Air Rescue and Air Transport Command. He came to the 306th 21 Aug 44 and served until Mar 45.

Andrew Bezak followup: Bezak, a 423rd engineer who completed his tour with the 306th, was KIA 25 Nov 44 on a mission to Merseberg with the 447th BG, when the plane crashed one km NW of Merseberg. On his second tour, this was his 40th mission.

Robert H. Clark, 367th ordnance worker and orderly room clerk, died 13 Jun 92 in Chicago Heights, IL. He retired as a clerk for LTV Steel, and had lived of late in Sauk Village, IL. He leaves his wife, three sons, 12 gc, and seven ggc.

Daniel Dolinka, a parachute rigger who became a 368th gunner and POW, died 24 Mar 92 in Chicago. He was on Fred Gillogly's crew that disappeared at Bremen 17 Apr 43. Dolinka ended up in Stalag Luft III.

Harry E. Holms, 369th waist gunner (Allan Lingwall crew)), is deceased. He arrived with the Group 15 Jun 44 and completed his tour in October.

Edwin J. Irwin, 369th tail gunner (Allan Lingwall crew), is deceased. His combat tour was from 15 Jun 44 to October.

Owen K. Nabors, 367th waist gunner (Dinwiddie Fuhrmeister crew), died 9 Jun 88 in Redmond, WA, where he had lived for many years. He was the 118th EM to complete a combat tour, arriving with the Group 4 May 43 and leaving 18 Nov 43.

William H. Owens. 369th and 367th navigator and POW, died 31 May 91 in Tullahoma, TN, following serious health problems. He joined the group 17 Jan 43, and transferred to the 367th 7 Apr



Mission Report Status, and The Future

Mission Reports are coming! They aren't all in hand at the moment, but another 2800 pages of material is in process and will be ready for distribution by mid-September.

A June trip to National Archives permitted a complete review of the 306th files, and coupled with another visit yet to be planned may result in the accumulation of at least some materials on every mission. In the meantime, we will continue to process orders and hope to clear up a number of the "back orders" before mid-August.

Even yet there are 21 missions for which materials cannot be found in the normal 306th files. They either disappeared in toto before the secretary began working in the files in 1976, or they have disappeared piecemeal since that time.

Security at National Archives is now very tight, and for good reason. It is the only way the files can be preserved form predators. Also, demands on National Archives for military history files have increased many times since 1976, while at the same time the operational staff for Archives has been decreased as funds have become scarcer.

On this lastest foray, the secretary brought home 350 pages that were copied on the spot. (A copier is available three minutes at a time, and with often a line waiting to use it.) Much of this material was where a single page was needed to complete a file, and a generous collection of mission route maps. Maps are more difficult to copy, and the secretary and his wife concluded that they could do a better job of copying than did the Archives staff. April 1991 Order

The next to appear will be an order

originally placed in April 1991, and which disappeared during shipment to the secretary. These files had to be reselected, and that has been accomplished. This included a few scattered missions in the second half of 1943, almost all of July 1944 and scattered missions throughout the remaining months of 1944.

The final group selected was scattered throughout 1944, a few in 1942 and 1943, and with major emphasis in January through March, 1945.

Through the generosity of individuals contributing to the Project Fund, and through appropriations of the general treasury all of this has been accomplished.


Men from other Bomb Groups, when hearing what we have readily available to our membership, express considerable envy, and we have yet to hear of a Group that has any appreciable mission report material available at all. A few have begun the collection, but then have just stored the paper away.

We are still searching for some crew lists from the mission loading list collection. We also are searching for some intelligence narratives. It is expected these may be found in some Eighth Air Force files we have not yet accessed.

If you have any navigation charts, formation sheets or mission flimsies, particularly of any of these dates, please make copies of them and forward them to the secretary.

In the meantime, the price remains the same, 3 files for \$5, and you can order as many at a time as you care.
