BOMBER COMMAND NARRATIVE OF OPERATIONS
Mission No. 42 - 12 March, 1943.

While the B-24's of 2nd Wing made an uneventful diversion off the Dutch coast, the B-17's of 1st Wing attacked with good results the Sotteville Marshalling Yards at Rouen. The B-17's which had strong fighter support had no encounters and reported only slight and inaccurate flak. All planes returned safely.

ROUTE: Out: Base to Dungeness; to 50° 13'N, 01° 15'E; to 50° 00'N, 00° 00'; thence north to rendezvous with fighters at Beachy Head; to I.P. at Fecamp; to Rouen.

Back: Turn right at Rouen; to Cap d'Antifer; to Beachy Head; to bases.

WEATHER: The 1st Wing encountered only isolated patches of cloud with 10-15 miles visibility over the Channel. This increased to 6/10 - 8/10 low cloud from the French coast inland, decreasing in the target area to 4/10 - 6/10 with 10-15 miles visibility. Conditions on the return route were similar.

BOMBING RESULTS: At Rouen the B-17's dropped 208 x 1000 and 210 x 500 G.P. bombs from 21000 - 24300 ft. at 1241-1244 hours. Photographs taken from planes making the attack confirmed crews' reports of good results, with many bursts visible on the marshalling yards and adjacent installations. Four distinct groups of bursts can be seen - one on the northern end and one on the southern end of the Reception Sidings, one on the Sorting Sidings, and one on the northern end of the Gare de l'Etat. Crews which observed heavy oily smoke rising 12000 ft. from a burst near the engine sheds believe oil storage or ammunition train may have been hit.

FLAK: Slight and inaccurate flak was encountered in the target area. Additional slight, inaccurate flak was reported near Norville and at a point on the coast between Fecamp and Cap d'Antifer. Bursts observed were mostly dark, with some white.

ENCOUNTERS: Eighth squadrons of Spitfires afforded support to the operation and two other fighter squadrons made a diversionary sweep. Crews of the B-17's observed only a few e/a, mostly FW 190's, and had no encounters. The Spitfires effectively covered the e/a which did get in range and were observed to shoot down one. The bomber crews were unanimous in their praise of the fighter cover.

REASONS FOR FAILURE TO BOMB: Nine B-17's failed to bomb the target due to mechanical failures of the a/c or equipment (including oxygen systems, superchargers, heating unit, oil pressure, and electric suit).

OBSERVATIONS: Heavy traffic was observed in the Rouen Marshalling Yards. What may be an army camp was seen at Caudebec. Eight to ten barges were sighted on the river, 30 miles east of Le Havre.

PART II - 2ND WING

Under favorable weather conditions the 2nd Wing a/c carried out an uneventful mission, with shipping off enemy coast as a potential target. All of the 18 B-24's dispatched, 6 from 44th and 12 from 93rd Group, completed the mission with the exception of one a/c from 93rd Group which left the formation due to mechanical failure. The route followed was from bases to Orfordness; to 51°20'N; 02°20'E, to 51°50'N, 03°15'E, to bases. No fighter opposition was encountered. Along the Dutch coast south of the Hague and west of Rotterdam two of the crews observed what appeared to be searchlights flashing on and off; but stated that this might have been the reflection of sunlight on greenhouses. One of the crews suggested the testing of electrical suits before issue, as three which were carried proved to be worthless.

1. 19 AC took off at 0940 hours to bomb the Marshalling Yards at Rouen, France. None returned early. All dropped their bombs on the target and returned safely. One AC brought back two bombs. The route was as ordered.

2. Due to splendid weather, the absence of flack, and excellent fighter support, an uninterrupted run on the target was permitted, and good bombing results achieved. Many bursts were observed directly on the A.P. and the installations adjacent thereto. Due to the heavy, oily smoke which mushroomed from the top of one burst, it is thought that an ~~ammunition~~ ammunition train was squarely hit. It is also believed that a hit was made on the viaduct leading from the yards across the Seine.

4. Not a single genuine attack from EA was reported. A few F. W. 's were seen but Spits were invariably on top of them. We are obviously making no claims.

24-Hour Blitz Again

ROUEN BOMBED IN DAYLIGHT

THE round-the-clock air onslaught on enemy targets in Europe—held up by bad weather—is on again.

A few hours after the Berlin raid on Saturday night U.S. heavy bombers, protected by R.A.F., Dominion and Allied fighters, yesterday pounded Rouen's vital railyards for the sixth time in daylight.

Venturas with fighter escort attacked Rotterdam shipping and shipbuilding yards at dusk. Mosquitos bombed industrial targets in Liège.

No planes are missing from the Rotterdam raid. One bomber and four fighters are missing from the Rouen attack, during which several enemy planes were destroyed.

Chased By Fighters

One wave of American bombers had to fight their way to Rouen through heavy fighter opposition. As they returned, too, enemy fighters hung on until the English coast was in sight.

An oil dump is believed to have been hit in Rouen, and damage was done to a bridge.

In the attack on Rotterdam two direct hits were scored on a minesweeper in Wilton Shipbuilding Yard. Floating pontoons in the New waterway also were bombed.

As the crews left they saw a large fire burning in the dock area.
