- (A) - 1. 26 AC took off in perfect weather at 0850 to bomb naval installations at Kiel. All 26 bombed the primary with good results. 1 AC landed away to refuel and then proceeded to base. The route flown was approximately as ordered and the weather continued good with unlimited visibility at the target. Very little flak was encountered on the mission, none of our A/C being damaged.
2. With practically an uninterrupted run on the target bombing appears very good. Heading about 55 degrees Mag. altitude 25000 feet. Entire target area was mass of smoke and flames. Very few bombs landed in water.
3. Nil.
4. Opposition was not intense although some 50 FW's and Me 109's were reported. Several attacks were pressed home but majority were feeble as though made by inexperienced pilots. E/A seemed to concentrate on B-24s, our gunners getting good shots during these attacks. Very few twin-engined fighters were reported. Single engines included red-nosed, silver and blue ME's and many night fighters.
5. Flak was surprisingly moderate and inaccurate on this group, most of it being encountered after leaving target. Bursts were mostly ahead and below and were the ordinary black and white colors.
6. 1 B-24 down in flames just before target - no chutes.  
1 B-24 blew up after being hit 5 minutes after target - no chutes.  
1 b-17 hit at target and went to pieces in air - 2 chutes.

8. Ineffective smoke screens at target and Eckendorf. Surprising scarcity of flak on this group. A well-planned mission. No aerial bombing reported today.



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- This shows a concentration of bursts on and near the GERMANIA SHIPBUILDING YARD, on the SOUTHERN part of the DEUTSCHE WERKE YARD, and on the area immediately to the EAST of these yards.  
In the GERMANIA YARD, hits are seen on the workshops, the slip ends and on the quays.  
At the DEUTSCHE WERFT YARD, hits are seen on the southern floating dock, on the edge of the building slips, and on the several sheds and stores.  
A burst is seen on the inner DOCK YARD BASIN near a 500 ton U-Boat and a probable 'M' class minesweeper.

- The second concentration of bursts is just east of the target, and is mainly in the residential area, although it includes the Police Barracks which has suffered several hits, and the Tramway Power House, which has also been hit.
- The third concentration is to the South East of the target, and bombs have straddled the railroad sidings. The main sidings have not been hit, but there are probable hits on the line in three places.
