Mission: Giessen A/B, Germany - 40th "B"

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H)

1. Narrative
306th flew 54 A/C including 4 PFF as 40 "B". Route was flown substantially as briefed: Clacton 1202; 511N - 0248E, 1208₂; I.P. 5024N - 0832E, 1440; Target 1447₂; Ostend 5116N - 0300E; Clacton, 1615., lead A/C landed at Debach, 1705. Buckeye called 30 minutes before target and reported CAVU conditions at target. All R2K equipment worked satisfactorily for navigation.
2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support
No fighter opposition was encountered. Fighter support was very good throughout mission.
3. A.A. Gun Fire
at target, meager accurate tracking A.A. Gun Fire. Occasional scattered bursts along route, chiefly from Koblenz area. Damage: Lead, nil; low, 1 severe; high, 2 severe.
4. Bombing
306th as 40th "B" bombed primary visually with good results. During bomb run, lead bombardier felt that his assigned aiming point had already been hit, so he changed his aiming point to 093015/5. Strike photos show that this point was well hit by lead and high squadrons. Low squadron's bombs are in built-up area to southwest of field.
5. Mickels
A/C 407-P, pilot Roper, dropped 7 T-251 and 3 T-248 on Giessen A/B.
6. Weather
10/10 over England, clear over Channel and continent, visibility 40 to 50 miles at target. Snow on ground. Slight ground haze over Belgium.

Mission: Nidda A/D, Germany, 40th "D", 24 December, 1944

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H)

1. Narrative

306th flew 12 A/C including 2 PFF as lead of 40th "D" and 3 A/C as high element of 40th "D" high. Route: 5 miles south of Clacton, 1209; Ostend 1244; I.P. 5015N-0805E at 1446 hours, went directly over target 1504 hours, but due to malfunction bombs did not release; made left turn for another run, and deputy took over lead, and with Bad Nauheim as I.P. made second run and bombed Nidda A/D 1513½; north of Koblenz; Ostend 1626; Clacton 1650; leader landed Bury St. Edmunds 1735.

2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

No fighter opposition was encountered. P-51s appeared south of Brussels as briefed.

3. A.A. Gun Fire

None at target. Scattered accurate tracking from 3 or 4 guns at 5014N-0947E, 1352 hours, on way in, and at 5020N-0620E on way out. Damage: lead, 3 slight, High, high, nil.

4. Bombing

306th as lead and high high of 40th "D" bombed primary visually with excellent results. Although directly over target at 1504 after good run, malfunction prevented lead bombs from going away. Leader made a left turn and told deputy to take over. Group made a second run, dropping at 1513½. High squadron was composed of three A/C from 306th plus two stragglers that had joined when A/C of the 92nd failed to assemble. These A/C dropped on lead. Strike photos show bombs over greater portion of A/D, fulfilling mission to posthole field.

5. Nickels

None ordered.

6. Weather

Cloud cover was 10/10ths over England, clear over Channel and continent, visibility 40 to 50 miles at target. Snow covered the ground. There was a slight ground haze over Belgium.

7. Observations

Towering column of black smoke, like oil fire, was seen near St. Vith. There were bursts of white smoke in the target area, somewhat resembling smoke bombs, although no previous bombing had occurred.



1. A/C 407-P, pilot Roper, dropped 7 T251 and 3 T248 on Giessen A/D.
2. 306th as 40th "B" bombed primary visually with good results. During bomb run, lead bombardier felt that his assigned aiming point had already been hit, so he changed his aiming point to 053015/5. Strike photos show that this point was well hit by lead and high squadrons. Low squadron's bombs are in built-up area to southwest of field.
3. None
4. At target, meager accurate tracking flak. Occasional scattered bursts along route, chiefly from Koblenz area.
5. 10/10 over England, clear over Channel and continent, visibility 40 to 50 miles at target. Snow on ground. Slight ground haze over Belgium.

Notes re Today's Mission (24 December).

1. Our control tower reports that A/C 407-P, pilot Roper, and A/C 604-A, and that truck is being sent to bring them back tonight. pilot Fowler, landed at Cranfield, finally got hold of Roper on the phone and asked him to bring his camera back (have also told the photo lab to stand by to develop strike photos from this camera when it arrives). Roper reports that he dropped all nickels on target. Fowler states that primary was bomb ed visually, and bombing was visual that he saw a circle of bursts right in the center of the A/D. Slight ground haze at target; fog over western France and England, otherwise clear. No battle damage; no enemy fighters. At target, tracking flak was meager to moderate. Fighter support O.K. Some flak along the route. Group assembly seemed O.K. although they believe that a few ships did not make the formation until leaving the English coast.

2. Our control tower reports that 1st. Div. states that A/C 429-W (our ops says Denny was flying it) landed at Wattisham, crew O.K., slight flak damage, after bombing primary visual.

3. Capt. Ludtke, 1st Div. phoned to say that 1st Div will probably do all interrogation and reports and that we will probably not have to do any interrogating when crews get back here. This will have to be checked tomorrow.

4. Sgt. Perry will bring Roper's camera to photo lab when it arrives.

5. If anything comes up that needs attention, do not hesitate to call Capt Pool on 193-R2.
