Mission: BIELEFELD, 26 October, 1944.

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H), APO 557

1. Narrative

306th flew 11 A/C plus 1 PFF plus 1 spare as 40 "A" High squadron and 11 A/C plus 1 PFF plus 1 spare as 40 "B" High squadron. 306th also flew 10 A/C plus 2 PFF on Screening Operation which is covered in separate report.

Route of 40th "A" High was approximately as briefed. Orfordness 1240 hours; 524LN-0438E at 1317 hours; target, 1404; 524LN-0438E, 1500 hours; 5217N-0138E at 1534 hours. Route of 40 "B" High was substantially as briefed; 4 miles south of Orfordness; Dutch coast 5237-0437, 1921; IP 1356; target Bielefeld 1410; Dutch coast 5333-0446, 1505; English coast 5157-0121, 1545; over base 1626, landed 1735.

Buckeye Blue was heard very faintly reporting 10/10 at target.

Mickey equipment of both 40 "A" and "B" high squadron leads functioned satisfactorily.

2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

No fighter opposition encountered. 40th "B" reports two contrails seen 8 miles north of Zwolle, 1336 hours, climbing at steep angle, about three miles away. Fighter support of P-51s was continuous from coast.

3. A.A. Gun Fire

Both "A" and "B" found no A.A. Gun Fire at target or enroute. Barrage observed at Munster. No damage.

4. Bombing

40th "A" leader made his own run on Bielefeld. Equipment working satisfactorily. Believes he hit in the town, north of center. As crews turned off target they were able to see, through hole in cloud, bomb flashes from "B" high squadron behind on eastern edge of city, continuing east in direction of ordnance depot.

40th "B" High leader made his own PFF run on Bielefeld when lead and low squadrons flew to right of briefed course and bombed Gutersloh. Our Mickey operator picked up good returns on Bielefeld from I.P. and released bombs to hit eastern part of city and trail across ordnance depot. Crews report that a hole in the clouds after bombing showed bursts in city. Pictures available are practically 10/10 with no ground detail.

5. Leaflets

A/C 323-H dropped 9 T190 and 1 W05D at Bielefeld.

6. Weather

10/10 over Continent, tops 8,000 feet, except for small break after bombs away.






