Flying Fortresses Smash Wilhelmshaven, Surprise Nazi Warships; Liberators Hit Targets in Northwest

American bombers in daylight yesterday struck their first blow of the war at Germany proper, dropping tons of high explosives on the Nazi naval base at Wilhelmshaven and other targets in Northwest Germany.

Concentration of 18 to 25 German Warships Stirs Speculation

A powerful concentration of German warships, discovered off Withelmshaven by American bombers returning from yesterday's raid on the Nazi naval base there, aroused speculation in London

A force of between 18 and 25 " large German ships," almost all of them of cruiser class or heavier, was reported steaming for Wilhelmshaven about midday yesterday.

The fleet was perhaps one of the best targets of the war on the seas, yet it went unbombed, for all of the American planes in the group which sighted it already had dropped their explosives with shattering effect on the docks and sub pens at Wilhelmshaven.

The mere presence in fleet formation of such a large German sea force, however, stirred naval observers to guess at the possible reasons for its presence.

'Looked Like Whole Navy'

" It looked like the whole damn German navy," declared Capt. John A. Ryan, Troy, N.Y., one of the Flying Fortress pilots who had to fly over the prize target with empty bomb racks.
