Mission: N. W. France. 28 February, 1944

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H)

1. Narrative

24 A/C of the 306th Bombardment Group took off at 1234 hours. They crossed the English Coast at Beachy Head at 1357; Etretat, 1420; I.P. as briefed; unable to identify target on first run due to haze and 5/10 to 7/10 cloud. Squadrons thereafter proceeded individually as follows.

A. Lead Squadron made 360 degree turn, passing through flak fringe north of Reuen. Despite severe flak damage the lead ship led the squadron in two additional runs over target in attempt to bomb, clouds preventing. They then turned for home passing 8 miles east of Fecamp, at 1510; two miles east of Newhaven, 1542; base at 1628.

B. High Squadron formed of 10 A/C turned left, passing north of original I.P. in 360 degree turn; spotted target on second run only 15 seconds before passing over it; repeated a full turn to left and dropped bombs as noted in paragraph on bombing below. From target they headed for base, arriving east of Beachy Head at 1545 hours; base at 1640 hours.

C. Low Squadron followed lead squadron on second run over target, then made three more complete runs unable to identify target positively; finally bombed target No. 106. Enemy coast was crossed at 49° 53'N., 00° 50'E., 1519 hours; base at 1654 hours.

2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

No enemy fighters were seen. P-38's, P-47's and P-51's provided area support. Spitfires and Typhoons also seen. We make no claims.

3. A.A. Gun Fire

Moderate but accurate flak from vicinity of Reuen caused most of our damage. Other flak reported from Fauville, Lillebonne, and Yvetot.

4. Bombing

Good bombing is revealed by photographs on target No. 106 by low Squadron, a heavy concentration falling in the western part of target area and shipload in the eastern part. Photographs show High Squadron's bombs concentrated on road junction three and a third miles east of Yerville on road to Totes. Lead Squadron did not bomb. 5/10 cloud cover made target identification extremely difficult. Lead squadron made 3 runs over primary, clouds making a bomb run impossible. High squadron also made 3 runs, finally dropping on above noted junction. Low squadron after 3 full turns in effort to positively identify primary, headed north searching for a similar target, and picked up above-noted target of opportunity through the clouds just in time to make a brief but effective run.

5. Weather

5/10s clouds made both target identification and bomb runs very difficult.

6. Aircraft net Bombing

Aircraft brought back a total of 71 x 500 H.E. bombs as follows; A/C #444, 12 x 500 H.E.; A/C #539, 12 x 500 H.E.; A/C #521, 12 x 500 H.E.; A/C #042, 12 x 500 H.E.; A/C #065, 11 x 500 H.E.; A/C #301 12 x 500 H.E.; 13 bombs were jettisoned as follows; A/C #505, 12 x 500 H.E. in English Channel, after serious flak damage to A/C; A/C #065, jettisoned 1 x 500 due to short circuit in toggle switch.

ROCKET COAST BLITZED

GIANT bombers of the Strategic Air Force joined with the Allied tactical formations yesterday to give the French "Rocket Coast" one of its heaviest batterings.

American Eighth Air Force heavies—Forts and Liberators—switched from their crippling assault on aircraft factories in Germany

They added several hundred tons of bombs to those which have already ploughed up secret Nazi military targets.

The Forts and Liberators, which were escorted by Lightnings, Thunderbolts and Mustangs, met no opposition from enemy aircraft.

One enemy plane was destroyed by United States fighters taking off. Six heavy bombers are missing.

Many Fires Started

Most of the pilots reported that their bombs had fallen "plumb on the target" and had started fires. At the same time Marauder medium-bombers of the United States Ninth Air Force resumed their double-edged daylight offensive in force.

Crossing the Channel in waves, more than 200 of the medium-bombers divided into a number of formations to make simultaneous attacks on the Pas de Calais and other military objectives.

One task force of Marauders drove 40 miles inland to attack the Nazi air base at Rosieres-en-Bantere.

The Marauders were escorted and covered by R.A.F. Dominions and Allied fighters.

None of our aircraft is missing, although bomber crews and fighter pilots reported flying through an unusually intensive flak belt.

Forts again bomb secret weapon coast

AMERICAN heavy and medium bombers yesterday resumed their offensive against target areas in Northern France.

A German airfield near Amiens was also attacked by the medium bombers.

Strategic as well as tactical formations were in action.

Flying Fortresses and Liberators, which were escorted by Lightnings, Thunderbolts and Mustangs, met no opposition from enemy aircraft.

One enemy aircraft was destroyed by fighters as it was taking off. Six heavy bombers are missing, but all the medium bombers returned safely.

During daylight yesterday there was no enemy air activity over Britain.

It is now known that another enemy aircraft was destroyed on the night of February 23/24 making a total of 14 aircraft.




