SUBJECT: Intelligence Report

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H)

1. Narrative

306th "A" Group followed by 306th "B" Group took off at 0740 hours and assembled as briefed in 40th "B" Combat Wing. Formation left Glaeton at 0943 hours behind Third Division. Our formation crossed enemy Coast just south of Ostend and proceeded on course to neighborhood of briefed I.P. Then a swing was made to the North East to allow 40th "A" Combat Wing which was abreast and on right to bomb first. After bombing, 40th "B" Combat Wing turned right sharply and came abreast on right hand of 40th "A" Combat Wing. Our formation after following approximately briefed course returned to Base at 1427 hours.

Abortions

A/C #196, Pilot Hilton, 369th Squadron, turned back at 0958 hours at 51°29'N.- 02°51'E. at 21,000 feet; cause: internal failure of #2 engine.
5 x 500 M64 and 7 x 500 M43 jettisoned soon after the turn, in mid-channel.

A/C #827, Pilot Brunn, 368th Squadron, turned back just past Liege, Belgium 22,500 feet, about 35 miles over enemy territory; cause: internal failure of #4 supercharger.

A/C #768, Pilot Czechowski, 369th Squadron, turned back over England after gyro compass and artificial horizon became inoperative and ship went into spiral spin. Right waist gunner bailed out when A/C first went temporarily out of control. He has returned to base.

2. Bombing

Bombing was on P.F.F. Lead Bombardiers and Navigators state that all P.F.F. A/C seemed to agree on location as all sky markers were close together. 306th bombs well grouped together, released on own P.F.F. Bombing results unobserved due to 10/10ths undercast.

3. Enemy Opposition

19 A/C plus 1 P.F.F. flew as 306th "A" Group leading 40th "B" Combat Wing and 19 A/C flew as 306th "B" Group in low position of same Combat Wing. 25 E/A, T/E and S/E were encountered. A gap in fighter support between end of P-47 cover and arrival of P-38 cover allowed E/A to make two passes on bombing run between 1103 and 1109 hours. Support was again absent from 1115 to 1130 hours during further attacks. All attacks were from tail. 3 JU 88s and 3 FW 190s attacked low group together twice on bombing run, both types throwing rockets from as close as 150 yards. At least two rockets burst between A/C of our formation without causing any damage. Our A/C claimed 2 JU 88s destroyed and one damaged and one FW 190 destroyed in this encounter. At 1115 hours about 10 to 15 JU 88s, ME 109s and FW 190s made similar attacks for 15 minutes on same Group. Of these our A/C claim one JU 88 and one ME 109 destroyed.

Two purple rockets from the ground bursting to one side of our formation on the bombing run and one red flare which burst after bombs away just before A.A. Gun Fire stopped and fighters came in, may have been signals to enemy fighters. We claim 6-0-1.

4. Fighter Support

From enemy Coast to bombing run, P-47s were observed in waves with possible gaps between. From 1130 hours to Coast on way out "waves" were again seen with our fighters bunched in greater numbers than before.

5. A.A. Gun Fire

Meager, inaccurate A.A. gun fire from Ostend, Liege, I.P. and Wiesbaden. At target moderate, both white and black bursts, tracking, some very high above but some fairly accurate. A barrage of light A.A. gun fire was observed 10,000 feet below and to the right. Ground rockets leaving a cork screw trail of white smoke were seen at the I.P. At the target, crews report two huge bursts each of which looked like a swarm of bees, 10 feet in diameter.

6. Observations

Several small objects around formation were observed by 1 A/C just before target area. They were black and cylindrical, possibly ten inches long by 4 inches wide. Each trailed about ten feet of wire. No explosions were seen.

7. Hot News

B-17s in distress.

0945 hours, 1 B-17 smoking and going down through clouds, about in mid-channel, apparently out of control (observing A/C #728 radiced position).

1109 hours, 1 B-17 down in flames. No chutes.


1120 hours, 1 B-17 just above clouds, under attack by 4 or 5 enemy fighters, one of which it shot down, still O.K. when observing A/C left French Coast.

1230 hours, 1 B-17 #285 with letter H above and letter Q below number on tail, going down under control attacked by 5 fighters; two and possibly more chutes seen. Not 306th ship. Did not observe any design such as square or triangle around letter "H".

1. One A/C 850-B, Pilot ~~THOMAS~~ Toombs, dropped 50 parcels G-24 Nickels over Primary.
 2. Bombing was on P.F.F. Lead Bombadiers and Navigators state that all P.F.F. A/C seemed to agree on location as all sky markers were close together. 306th bombs well grouped together, released on own P.F.F. Bombing results unobserved due to 10/10ths undercast.
 3. 19 A.C plus 1 P.F.F. flew as 306 "A" Group leading 40 "B" Combat Wing and 19 A/C flew as 306 "B" group in low position of same Combat Wing.

~~XXXXXX~~ About ~~XXXXXX~~ 25 E/A, T/E and S/E were encountered. A gap in fighter support between end of P-47 cover and arrival of P-38 cover allowed E/A to make two passes on bombing run between 1103 and 1109 hours. Support was again absent from 1115 to 1130 during further attacks. All attacks were from tail. 3 JU88s and 3 FW190s attacked low group together twice on bombing run both types throwing rockets from as close as 150 yards. At least two rockets burst between A/C of our formation without causing any damage. Our A/C claimed 2 JU 88s destroyed and one damaged and one FW 190 destroyed in this encounter.

At 1115 about 10 to 15 JU88s, ME109s and FW190s made similar attacks for 15 minutes on same group. Of these our A/C claim one JU88 and one ME109 destroyed.

Two purple rockets from the ground bursting to one side of our formation on the bombing run and one red flare which burst after bombs away just before flak stopped and fighters came in, may have been signals to enemy fighters.

From enemy coast to bombing run, P-47s were observed in waves with possible gaps between. From 1130 to coast on way out "waves" were again seen with our fighters bunched in greater numbers than before. (We claim 6-Q-1)
