SUBJECT: Intelligence Narrative

TO.....: Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H)

1. Hot News

One and possibly two B-17s in distress. One at 1250 hours, a few miles southeast of Felixstowe, was seen to go down through clouds under control circled by two Spitfires. The tail gunner of the reporting aircraft thought he saw another B-17 in the water in the same vicinity. Before the target, at 1055 hours, one B-17 peeled off group behind, salvoed bombs. Was then seen to hit ground and explode. No chutes. Another at 1124 hours, southwest of Aachen, was losing altitude, followed by enemy fighters.

2. Narrative

18 A/C took off at 0630 hours. Were over Felixstowe at 0930 hours. Course was as briefed except for S-turns just before I.P.

3. Fighter Opposition

There were no fighter attacks on the 306th, (lead Group of lead Combat Wing) as long as the fighter escort was present. E/A observed at the I.P., and group came under intense and determined attack as soon as bombs were away, attacks continuing from 1059 to 1140. A total of 75 E/A encountered. Our high squadron, which had worst time, sustained from 20 to 25 direct attacks. Attacks were by pairs and by threes. Several times seven or eight planes queued up coming in one after another. Attacks mostly from level, from all angles. Twin engines hung back picking on stragglers. A few Me-110s, 210s, Ju-88s, and one FW-189 (twin boom) reported, but most attacks were made by red nose FW-190s. Other FWs had yellow or black noses. Four or five E/A observed with landing gear down - possibly fixed landing gear. Identity unknown - possibly Ju-87. These stayed at distance and did not attack. Some FW190s and some Me109s were reported with belly tanks.

4. A.A. Gun Fire

A.A. Gun Fire was moderate to intense, continuously pointed and very accurate in target area. All A/C but one over Germany received A.A. gun fire damage. Meager, inaccurate gunfire was encountered over entire route.

5. Bombing

Lead bombardier reports excellent bomb run and positive target identification all the way from the I.P. Pictures show target clearly, bombs exactly in line just short of target.

6. Comment

There were two abortions from our high squadron. Robinson lost an engine and Bisson and Thomas stayed with him. Kogima took over hole in lead squadron made vacant by Katz's turnback. This 3 A/C high squadron was in difficulties because the group behind kept overrunning them continuously, and at practically the same altitude. Most of our boys criticized Combat Wing formation





④ Many E/A use rocket guns. Two FW 190's fired what appeared to be rapid fire rocket guns. The flash was pink and about the size of flak. Me 110's firing rockets flew in formations of three in trail of low Squadron of low group. Projectile comes from receptacle under fuselage and appears to be about two feet long and eight inches in diameter. J. 88's firing rockets from receptacles between the engine nacelles. Other T/E enemy aircraft fighters fired large bursts from what looked like belly tanks situated about six feet from each wing tip. Flashes from rockets were reported stringing out behind E/A and almost completely obscuring the fuselage from view.

306TH GROUP, LOW GROUP OF 40TH COMBAT WING. SOME 150 E/A MAINLY JU-88'S AND ME 110'S ATTACKED HEAVILY AND RESOURCEFULLY AND FROM ALL DIRECTIONS FOR ABOUT 40 MINUTES, FROM 14:30 TO ABOUT 1531. THIS RAPID FIRE LASTED SEVERAL SECONDS. IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE TARGET, SEVERAL CREWS REPORTED SEEING X DISCUS-SHAPED OBJECTS FALL THROUGH THE FORMATION, SOME BURSTING ACCURATELY AT OUR ALTITUDE, AND THEN CLOSING XXXX AND THEN CLOSE ENOUGH TO SHAKE OUR PLANES WITH BURSTS OF FLAK SIZE. ONE CLUSTER OF 12 SUCH OBJECTS WAS SEEN, A/C DROPPING THEM THERE WERE NOT OBSERVED.
