Mission: Koblentz & Koblenz

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H)

1. Narrative

The 306th Group flew 11 A/C plus 1 PFF as high squadron 40 "A" group and 11 A/C plus 1 PFF as high squadron 40 "B" group, plus two spares. Route of 40 "A" was substantially as briefed. Felixstow 1010; Belgian coast, 5118N x 0303E, 1040; I.P. 5110N x 0600E, 1124; Target, Cologne, 1136 $\frac{1}{2}$; Belgian coast, 5110N x 0245E, 1306; Felixstow, 1332; Base 1415.

Route of 40 "B" high followed lead squadron about 12 miles north of course to an I.P. 5115N x 0600E, at 1127; over Cologne 1142, without dropping; went east, then southwest, bombing Koblenz 1207; out as briefed; Belgian coast, 5110N x 0245E, 1300; Felixstow 1320; Base 1407.

2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

There was no E/A opposition on this Group.

Fighter support was first picked up at 1100 hours at 5100N x 0500E. P-51's gave close support all the way and a few P-47's were seen.

3. A.A. Gun Fire

40 "A" high encountered moderate inaccurate tracking; A.A. fire at Gladbeck and Cologne. At Cologne flak commenced about two minutes before bombs away and lasted approximately five minutes. Excepting a few white bursts high above formation, the A.A. fire was low and in the chaff trail. No A/C damaged.

40 "B" high found the A.A. fire at Cologne far below it. At Koblenz meager tracking from about four guns was quite accurate, probably due to lack of chaff. Damage, probably all from Koblenz, 3 minor, 1 severe.

4. Bombing

40 "A" high dropped on bombs of lead squadron at 1136 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours. Bomb run was PFF over solid undercast.

40 "B" high squadron was unable to keep in visual contact with lead squadron after I.P., due to dense contrails. Temporary weakness of Mickey equipment during run on Cologne made bombing impossible. After turn off target PFF set resumed function, and the squadron made a PFF run on Koblenz dropping at 1207. Photos show 10/10 coverage at each target with no ground detail.

5. Nickels

A/C #619-5, pilot Walter, dropped 10 T-170's on PFF secondary.

6. Weather

Bombing was hampered by 10/10 undercast and dense persistent contrails. The channel was clear and over Belgium there was a 5/10 undercast with haze. Returning there were three distinct layers from Mainz to Brussels. They were roughly from 20 - 24,000 feet, 12-16,000 feet, and 4-8,000 feet.

7. PFF Equipment

Two PFF A/C were flown, as leads of high squadrons of 40 "A" and 40 "B", respectively. Both operators reported weaker returns along bomb run on Cologne than before I.P. and operator of 40 "B" equipment was unable to identify target on scope due to very weak returns. After target area 40 "B" equipment again gave satisfactory returns, making possible an individual PFF run on Kohlens.

8. Chaff

It is felt chaff at Cologne was very effective. 40 "A" and "B" were at end of first division column so that target was probably saturated when they came over. Both high squadrons traveled entire length of Cologne A.A. fire area without a hole in any ship. When "B" squadron bombed Kohlens, they were first to bomb, there was no chaff over target, their own chaff had been dropped at Cologne, and the few guns there were comparatively accurate. 12 ships over target - damage 3 slight, 1 severe. Mickey operators also feel the amount of chaff over Cologne may be answer to poor returns on bomb run.

9. A/C Returning Early

A/C 444-Y, and 477-V, both spares, turned back as briefed. Each brought back 12 x H17.
