Mission: Dortmund, 7th March, 1945

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H).

1. Narrative

306th flew 39 a/c, including 1 Gee-H-PTF, 3 PFF and 3 spares, as 40 "B". Assembly satisfactory. Crosser, 0928, 11,200 feet; Dutch coast 5237N-0437E, 1013, 18,600 feet. About 1020 hours, Buckeye Red reported all targets completely overcast. After taking I.P. for primary at 5203N-0711E, 1045 hours, 23,000 feet, lead Gee-H was found to be inoperative. Group gained 1,000 feet for PFF run on secondary, Siegen; and took I.P. at 5120N-0800E, 1103 hours, 21,000 feet. Unable to pick up Siegen on Mickey scopes, lead and high made right turn, took I.P. for Giessen at 5052N-0747E and bombed Giessen at 1145; then turned left and rejoined bomber stream at 5012N-0752E, 1202 hours. Low squadron Mickey picked up secondary late during run from I.P. 5120N-0800E, so the low made a 180 degree turn, took I.P. at 5040N-0756E, 1126 hours; bombed Siegen, 1131 hours. Route out as briefed, lead times: French coast 5030N-0136E, 1333 hours; Beachy Head 1353 1/2; base 1500 hours.

PFF: Interference on lead PFF set prevented operator from picking up targets. All other PFF equipment worked satisfactorily, although operators report that targets were so small they did not make good H2K targets.

Lead Gee-H equipment went out after I.P.

2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

This group encountered no fighter opposition.

F-51s, first seen at Zuider Zee, 1030 hours, gave support to target in elements of 4's and 6's; good in target area. Support given to stragglers on route out.

3. A.A. Gun Fire

Moderate, inaccurate barrage observed from Hurn and Dortmund caused no damage on this group. No A.A. fire observed Giessen or Siegen or elsewhere on route.

4. Bombing

40 "B" lead and high attacked briefed tertiary, Giessen, PFF. Low bombed briefed secondary, Siegen, PFF. Just after I.P. for primary, lead found Gee-H was inoperative and decided to make PFF run on secondary. Lead Mickey equipment gave insufficient returns and deputy took over near Dortmund. Group passed over Siegen, but deputy lead and high Mickey scopes gave inadequate returns. Lead therefore bombed Giessen, briefed tertiary, PFF. High dropped on snake bombs of lead. Low picked up Siegen on scope first time over, did not have time to drop due to excessive ground speed. Hearing instructions to bomb secondary if possible, low made a second run on Siegen and dropped PFF. Photos show no ground detail.

5. Leaflets

A/c 585-X dropped 2 H2151 and 8 T321 on Giessen.

6. Weather

10/10 cloud cover tops about 10,000 feet, over entire route with exception of occasional small breaks in Portland area. Thin cirrus, 16,000 feet, over North sea. Dense, persistent contrails from 20 to 22,000 feet, visibility unrestricted above 23,000 feet except for periodic haze at altitude.

7. Observations

Vertical contrail, possibly V-2, at 5239H-0545H at approximately 1030 hours. — No counter battery fire observed due to 10/10 at front lines on way out.

8. Our Aircraft in Distress

a/c 807-P, pilot Steiger, and a/c 474-V, pilot Cohn, collided at 5207H-0710H, 1048 hours. a/c 807-P dropped back, his tail section ran into #1 prop of 474-V, knocking off prop. 474-V and crew safe at base; 807-P found crashed on continent near A-70. Tail gunner believed dead, pilot and co-pilot unaccounted for. Rest of crew reported safe at A-70.

9. Aircraft Returning Early

No a/c returned early.



306th Group Narrative - Mission to Dortmund - 7 March 1945

1. A/C 585-K dropped 2 BG-151 and 8 T-321 on Giessen.

2.

2. 40 "B" lead and high attacked briefed tertiary, Giessen, PFF. Low bombed briefed secondary, Siegen, PFF. Just after IP for primary, lead found Gee-H inoperative and decided to make PFF run on secondary. Lead mickey equipment gave insufficient returns and deputy took over near Dortmund. Group passed over Siegen, but ^{deputy} lead and high Mickey scopes ^{gave inadequate returns.} failed to show it clearly. Lead therefore bombed Giessen, briefed tertiary ^(PFF) High dropping ^{ed} on smoke bombs of lead. ~~low, although~~ low picking ^{ed} up Siegen on scope first time over, did not have time to drop due to excessive ground speed. ^{Hearing instructions} ~~Told by lead~~ to bomb secondary if possible, low made a second run on Siegen and dropped PFF. Photos show no ground detail.

4. Moderate, inaccurate barrage observed from Hamm and Dortmund caused no damage on this group. No flak observed at Giessen or Siegen or elsewhere on route.

5. 10/10 cloud cover ^{tops about 10,000 feet,} over entire route with ~~the~~ exception of occasional small breaks in Dortmund area. Thin cirrus, 16,000 feet, over North Sea. Dense, persistent contrails from 20,000 to 22,000 feet, visibility unrestricted above 23,000 feet except for periodic haze at altitude.

6. Vertical contrail, possibly V-2, at 5239N-0545E at approximately 1030 hours.

7. 306th flew 39 A/C, including 1 Gee-H-PFF, 3 PFF and 3 spares, as 40 "B". Assembly satisfactory. Cromer, 0928, 14,800 feet; Dutch coast 5237-0437E, 1013 hours, 18,600 feet. About 1020 hours, Buckeye Red reported all targets ~~xxxxxx~~ completely overcast. After taking IP for primary at 5208-0711E,

1045 hours, 23,000 feet, ^{lead} Gee-H was found to be inoperative. ~~xxxxxx~~ Group gained 1,000 feet for PFF run on secondary/ Siegen;

and took IP at 5120-0800E, 1103 hours, 24,000 feet. Unable to pick up Siegen ^{Nicky} on scopes, lead and high made right turn, took IP for Giessen at 5052-0747E

and bombed ~~Giessen~~ ~~xxxxxx~~ at 1145; then turned left and re joined bomber stream at 5012-0752E, 1202 hours. ^{Low} squadron ~~xxxxxx~~ late during run from IP 5120-0800E,

~~xxxxxx~~ picked up secondary, ~~xxxxxx~~ ^{so the} low made a 180 degree turn, took IP at 5040-0756E, 1126 hours; ~~the~~ bombed Siegen, 1131 hours. Route out as briefed, ~~the~~ lead times: French coast 5030-0136E, 1333 hours; Beachy Head

Interference on lead PFF set prevented operator from picking up targets.

All other PFF equipment worked satisfactorily, although operators report that targets were so small they did not make good ^{H2X} ~~PFF~~ targets.

Lead Gee H equipment went out ^{after IP.} ~~xxxxxx~~ run.

No a/c returned early.






