SUBJECT: Intelligence Narrative

MISSION: BERLIN, 8 May, 1944.

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H), APO 557.

1. Narrative

32 A/C of the 306th Group took off at 0612 hours flying Low Group and Lead and Low Squadrons of High Group in 40th CBW. Rendezvous and assembly were all right. At start of climb, around 0956 hours, our crews in Low Group had great difficulty in keeping up, the leader of the Low Squadron, for instance, reporting he had to indicate 160, and when formation levelled off, he was indicating 170.

A/C #943, pilot Keilt, could not keep up and jettisoned bombs NE of Hannover to lighten load.

A/C #505, pilot Leedy, was pulling maximum power, could not keep up, and jettisoned at 1032 hours to lighten load.

A/C # 148, pilot Trigg, lost an engine, not due to enemy action, jettisoned bombs at 1035 hours, turned back and returned to base alone.

A/C # 129, pilot McDonough, could not keep up in steep climb, jettisoned bombs at 1041 hours to stay with formation.

A/C # 259, pilot Smith, dropped behind at 0959 hours just after start of climb. He came back to formation, then fell behind and was never seen again. A/C did not return to base.

All 5 of above A/C flew in 306th Low Group.

At 1042 hours, one A/C collided with another, taking down a third as they fall. A/C involved were # 239, pilot Lambert, # 942, pilot Jacobs, and # 969, pilot Schlecht. These three A/C were in High Group. Some crews report one chute, but contrails below prevented accurate observation. Magee A/C # 113-W, and Burgess, # 181-B, both of whom flew near the A/C involved, agree that the following is substantially what happened: Jacobs was flying in # 2 position of lead element, Low Squadron High Composite Group. He originally flew # 3, but dropped back, and when he regained the formation he found Matichka had moved into his old position, so Jacobs took over the # 2 spot. Reports agree that both Jacobs and Lambert were flying wide. At 1042 hours, with heavy persistent con-trails, making visibility difficult, Lambert was apparently caught in prop wash and was pitched around. Lambert moved to his left trying to avoid the prop wash, and his plane came down on top of Jacob's ship. Lambert's left wing panel flew off, and his A/C seemed to make a loop around the fuselage of Jacob's ship, cutting or knocking the tail section completely off. The tail section dropped and hit the wing of the plane in the hole, A/C # 969-Y, pilot Schlecht, knocking him down, as well.

A/C # 008, pilot Matichka was reported with formation when bombs were away. After bombing, he left formation with no apparent trouble. He did not return to base.

Wing leadership was praised for the right turn off target, averaging 225 degrees magnetic, which avoided flak seen to be engaging those CBW's which

held to the briefed course. CBW was south of course for a time coming back, drawing flak from A/D at Bramsche and Rheine which were identified through clouds. Except for above, course was approximately as briefed: English Coast 0817 hours, Dutch Coast 0853 hours, target 1111 hours, Dutch Coast 1305 hours, English Coast 1343 hours. Planes landed at Base 1417 hours.

2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

No E/A encountered. At 0959 hours, North of Nienburg, crews report wing to left ahead under attack. Support left 40th CBW and went to rescue, but not before 3 B-17's were seen to go down, one exploding in air. Crews are of the opinion that the formation under attack was probably last Combat Wing of 3rd Division. Our support was better than briefed, no gaps being reported. More friendly A/C seen than briefed, the feeling being that part of the 3rd Division support was with 40th CBW.

3. A.A. Gun Fire

Berlin: Moderate, inaccurate barrage and tracking. Very low at first, but came up to altitude after 40th CBW passed over the city. Practically no A.A. gun fire until after bombs away. A few bursts in Dummer Lake area on way out.

4. Bombing

Bombing was on PFF through 10/10ths undercast. Good pattern reported.

5. Leaflets

No leaflets carried. Planes were loaded for French Mission.

6. Weather

6 to 7/10ths cloud up to 10 degrees East, then practically solid with dense, persistent contrails at altitude.

7. Observations

Good-sized ship off Enkhuizen in Zuider Zee. Same ship seen on last two or three missions.

8. Other Aircraft In Distress

B-17, at 1000 hours, straggler from formation ahead, seen making slow circles with chutes coming out, then later seen in spin. 6 or 7 chutes were seen. See: Paragraph 2 above, 3 B-17's hit near Nienburg.

9. A/C Returning Early, Not Dispatched

A/C #444-Y and #836-P, spares, turned back at 52°40'N x 03°08'E at 0834 hours. Each A/C brought back 10 x 500 M43's.

## VIII BOMBER COMMAND - PROPOSED OVERALL PLAN



1. No leaflets. Planes loaded for French mission.
2. Bombing on PFF thru 10/10 undercast. Good pattern reported.

Crews feel they were well over town judging by ETA and flak.

3. No e/a encountered. At 0959, north of Nienburg, crews report wing to left ahead under attack. Support left 40th and went to rescue, but not before 3 B-17's were seen to go down, one exploding in air. Crews are of the opinion that the formation under attack was probably last Combat Wing of 3rd Division. Our support was better than briefed, no gaps being reported. More friendly a/c seen than briefed, the feeling being that part of the 3rd Division support was with 40th.

4. Berlin: moderate, inaccurate barrage and tracking. Very low at first, but came up to altitude after 40th passed over the city. Practically no flak until after bombs away. A few bursts in Dummer Lake area on way out.

Subject: Pilot's Mission Report.

TO : A.C. of A.S., Intelligence, Headquarters, A.A.F., Washington, D. C.

Through: A.C. of S., G-2, War Department, Washington, D. C.

The following report was submitted by pilot, 2nd Lt. Louis F. Matichka, ASN 0-753805, who ditched a Flying Fortress off the coast of Sweden on May 8, 1944.

A. Ship Type, Number, Pilot, Unit:

B-17, #238008, pilot, Louis F. Matichka, 2nd Lt., 0-238008, 306th Bomb Group, 367 Bomb Squadron.

B. Time of Take Off (Date):

0610 hours, departed English coast 0845 hours at 15,000 feet, and arrived enemy coast 0928 hours at 22,000 ft.

C. Defects In Ship on Trip Out:

Oil pressure dropped below 50 lbs. on #1 engine, unable to feather prop.

D. Time & Place of Enemy Fighter Opposition, Action of Friendly Fighters:

None.

E. Target: A. Briefed Target. B. Bombed Target. Bombs Dropped (Type & How Dropped, Altitude, Results):

Briefed target Berlin, Germany, PPP. Bombs were salvoed approximately 2 miles north of the I.P., but strikes were not observed because of cloud. Bombs dropped from 27,000 Ft.

F. Ground Defense:

Encountered 2 flak barrages from I.P. out on course of 10 degrees magnetic.

G. When & Where Decision Made to Land in Sweden & Why:

Left formation at 53-03 N. 13-49 E., at 1105 hours, approximately 15 minutes before I.P. having lost all oil pressure on #1 engine. An attempt was made to feather prop before oil pressure dropped below 50 lbs., to no avail. Up to the time we lost #1 engine we were constantly using 2500 RPM and 46 inches mercury to remain in formation, due to our position in formation and the rate of climb lead ship was using. An attempt was made to stay in formation with #1 prop windmilling.

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and pulling 2500 RPM and 50 inches mercury on the three remaining engines. Approximately 5 minutes before I.P. the co-pilot checked the gas gauges which read approximately 500 gallons gas remaining. At this time #4 engine began to detonate and vibrate excessively, with cylinder head temp. reading about 250 degrees C. We began to straggle and when our group turned on the I.P. we were straggling a considerable distance behind them. Because of the acute gas situation and our inability to remain in formation on two engines, and one of them detonating, a decision was reached to strike out for the Baltic Sea rather than the briefed route home, which if followed, would have probably landed us in German occupied territory. It was impossible to notify our formation leader, the VHF radio being inoperative. Bombs were salvoed, and on leaving the I.P. encountered two barrages of flak from the I.P. out. One burst hit the radio room, knocking out the liaison transmitter. Upon assuming we were over the sea, we decided to let down through the overcast, breaking out 50 ft above the water. The visibility was very poor due to precipitation and we continued on a magnetic course of 10 degrees until landfall was observed. Landfall was an island which did not appear on any of the navigator's charts. Not being certain of the position other than by D.K., navigator decided to follow coast until able to pin point. Island on our right and about 5 minutes later land appeared on our left. We continued midway between the bodies of land until island on right ended. Still not having found any landmarks identifiable on navigator's charts, at 1315 hours, with approximately 100 gallons of gas, we flew over the land on left searching for a field suitable for a crash landing. This attempt failed as land was heavily forested and rough. Having but a few minutes of gas left we then prepared to ditch about one half mile off shore. #4 engine quit running and no attempt was made to feather since ditching was imminent. As we were taking up positions for ditching two Swedish, single engine planes appeared and beckoned us to follow them inland. Because of the acute gas shortage we had no alternative but to ditch. We followed Swedish planes for about 2 minutes when engines began to sputter. We made a turn toward land and ditched about one half mile off shore at 1345 hours. Plane and all equipment sank about one and one half minutes after landing.

H. Opposition After Leaving Formation:

Flak after leaving I.P. on way out.

I. Claims of Enemy Fighters Destroyed:

None.

J. Disposition of Classified Equipment:

No disposition. Equipment went down with plane.

K. Time of Landing in Sweden (Ditching off shore) and Damage Sustained:

No injuries sustained by crew in ditching - plane and equipment sank about one and one half minutes after ditching.

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*April 8 mission*

Report of collision of three ...

Reed, a/c 939-A, states; another squadron flying above Lambert, backed down on Lambert and cut tail off. Turned over on side, went down. No chutes seen.

Magee, a/c 133-W states: at 1042 hours, with heavy persistent con trails making visibility difficult, Lambert was apparently caught in prop wash (they could not tell whose) and was pitched around. At that time, Jacobs' was flying #2 of lead element low sqdn, Composite group. He had gone in there after dropping back, and upon trying to regain his position, finding that Matichka (who had also been thrown out by prop wash) had moved over to #3 position. This had occurred before the collision. Lambert peeled to his left trying to avoid prop wash, with Jacobs flying a bit wide. Lambert's ship came down on top of Jacob's plane, breaking off the right wing of the latter's a/c. Lambert's a/c seemed to do a circle around the fuselage of Jacob's a/c, knocking the tail off the latter a/c. This tail hit the right wing of the plane in the hole (Schlecht) and he too went down. No chutes seen. Three planes with "B" in a triangle were reported flying between lead and low sqdns, moving "all over the place", higher; lower; and generally about. ( Cf. Burgess report)

Tripp, a/c 327-U, says: Collision 5305N-1225E, 1042 hours, two B-17s came together

and hit a third all three came apart and went down, one chute seen, might have been chance for others to get out.

Trigg, a/c 148-K, ball turret reports three chutes from collision craft.

Dowell, a/c 198-D, saw one ship of collision in flat spin, smoking, and flames.

Kealing, a/c 897-S, 1042 hours, saw two B-17s going down, one without a wing, one without tail. Did not see actual collision. No chutes seen.

McDonough, a/c 129-L, 3 B-17s hi Group hit by A/c from left, spun down clipped tail off one below. All three down, no chutes.

McDaniel, 155-J, 1042 hours, collision, wings and fuselage broken off and spiralled down. No chutes, 26,000 feet.

Keilt, a/c 943-L, says: saw two a/c, believed from 10 sqdn, in collision, saw three go down, no chutes.

Yass, a/c 180-K ~~says~~ 1043 hours, low sqdn making left turn and high sqdn making right turn, very dense con trails and poor visibility at the times A/C # 239 (Lambert) skidded over and dropped down on A/C # 942 (Jacobs) — sliced Jacob's right wing off as the two a/c broke away. a/c # 239 (Lambert) fell on a/c # 969 (Schlecht) All three a/c broke up. No chutes seen.

Sutton, a/c # 055-N, 1043 collision, 1 chute, at 5258N-12<sup>4</sup>2E. ~~xx/xx/xx~~

Malson, a/c 163-N, says: 3 B-17s composite group crashed midair, no chutes seen.

McGuire, a/c # 099-S, didn't see collision, only saw three B-17s going down out of control, 1043 hours, approximately 5300N- 1140E.

Capt & Mission

Leedy, a/c 505-V, 1026 hours, two B-17s in midair crash, one with letter "B" in triangle— one chute seen.

Johns, a/c 185-J, 1005 hours, no chutes from collision. One skidded into the other, pieces hit wing of third ship, all fairly well disintegrated, but middle one more so.

Peterson, a/c 143-p, 1042 hours, 3 B-17s collided near Perleberg before target. This a/c took pictures. No chutes seen.

Shutz, a/c 397-O, 1043 collision, no chutes.

Munn, a/c 737-U, S/Ns: at 0954 hours, 5246N-0920E, 25,000 feet, a/c with either letter "B" or "G" in a triangle and a yellow "J"(small) under the triangle, came up from below through our formation, salvoed bombs in near a little village; our A/C 558, pilot Troup was forced out of formation and our a/c 737, pilot Munn was forced over into the lead sqdn. This strange a/c continued on up and disappeared into the con trails. A very few seconds later our three a/c were knocked down. Lt. Munn is positive this A/C caused the collision.. No chutes seen.

Troup, a/c 588-D, 1042 , 5300N- 1250E, two B-17s on left lost tails ; one on right #1 engine and left outer wing came off.

Kryzton, a/c # 113-G, did not see actual collision but saw parts of A/C falling , and then the planes themselves.

Burgess, a/c 181-B( Compare this with Magee's report above) Story of this crew paralleled almost exactly the story told by Magee's crew. The following additional facts were reported: The props of Lambert's a/c cut through the cockpit of Jacob's ship; IAS at the time seemed to be high though the pilot and Co-P could not say just what it was. Schlecht's left wing was struck by debris and his #1 engine was also hit. Ball turret watched two a/c till out of sight in clouds and did not see any chutes. This crew thought that the prop wash that originally caused Matichka to shift over to #3 position came from " the low group ahead".

Saunders, a/c 153-V, says : ship from low sqdn, apparently due to prop wash came over, crowding # 239, hit wing of #239, and turned over so that two a/c were back to back and disintegrated, falling and hitting wing of another a.c in low s-dn. All went down. No chutes seen.

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L. Damage to Ship by Enemy Action:

Burst of flak in radio room knocked out liaison transmitter.

M. Fuel Now Aboard Ship:

No fuel left at ditching.
