- 0830 Weather ship off
- 0840 made necessary calls for ops T.O. all to be  
stationed by 0940
- 0910 Capt. Witt requests Maj. Hartsele give Flying  
Control lecture at 1400 at Briefing room.
- 0935 No change in maneuver -  $40^{\circ}$  C.W.
- 1016 Last ops % airborne
- 1105 Div. informs us we may have to take Chelveston early  
returns because their R/W is blocked temporarily.
- 1200 April 18. On duty Capt. Bradbury. Lt. Crane
- 1310 Div. says they might send an ANCIENT-V  
over from Chelveston if they can't land him.  
This ship reported on fire
- 1320 ANCIENT-V has put out fire - bonds on board
- 1610 Changed to 24
- 1635 Perimeter track is now equipped with  
amber on outside & blue on inside.
- 2050 Flane path laid on R/W 24
- 2120 We are alerted.
- 2215 Mr. Ops advises that we will get two  
PFF ships from Chelveston.
- 2245 Chelvestons advise the two PFF ships  
will arrive here about 1145. Ship #1's  
533 Lt. Field and 766 Lt. Czechowski.
