the ensuing conversation attempted to obtain information pertaining to the time of their arrival in the British Isles; where their camp was located, and the ranks of the officers over them. This person talked with an imerican accent and claimed to be a Texan. At the time he was wearing an officer's field cap; officer's O.D. shirt without shoulder or collar insignia; officer's dark O.D. slacks; black shoes; but was not wearing a tie, blouse, or field jacket.

His physical description is as follows: AGE, 10-20; face - full; Nose - sharp. HEIGHT, 5' 7". WEIGHT, 130-140 pound; build - medium; complexion - fair, clean shaven.

- (2) "11 commands should be on the clert for the appearance of this person and should take steps to detain him or interrogation whereever he may be located.
- . (3) In view of the above stated facts, it appears appropriate that mesures be taken to review and tighten up on all a curity regulations, especially those relating to conversation and "loose tell" in public places.
